Why Study the Subject/what students Like about it

A-Level Drama and Theatre, offers you the opportunity to explore drama as a practical art form, in which ideas and meaning are communicated to an audience. The A Level Drama course focuses on the direction and performance of plays throughout history and the critical analysis of live theatre seen on stage. One of the main appeals of the subject is the emphasis on group activities, so the learning takes place through the shared experience of watching theatre and of making drama as part of a group.
