## RESULTS DAY...What's next?

### Enrolment

Colleges and sixth forms will enrol students either on or soon after results day. It is advisable not to arrange any holidays at this time, if possible. Please look out for communication from colleges about these arrangements. In most cases, you will be given a time slot to attend an enrolment interview in person. You will need to take your results with you to show that you have met the entrance requirements. The college will then be able to confirm your place and provide all the information you need to get started on their course. If you have still not heard from the college at this stage, I suggest that you phone them to clarify arrangements.

### If results are not as expected

If your results mean that you have not met the entrance requirements, please don't panic. It is very important that you still attend your enrolment interview, as planned, and seek advice. In some cases, the college will be able to offer an alternative course. For example, this may be in the same subject area, but at Level 1 or 2, rather than at Level 2 or 3. This just means that you may be at college for an extra year which will give you a chance to consolidate and perhaps retake your Maths and English to achieve the grades you need to progress. Additionally, some colleges such as Paston and City College, still have places available for late applications onto some courses in August. So, rest assured that there will be an alternative option available.

### Apprenticeships

If you are not sure that college is the right pathway for you, it is not too late to apply for an apprenticeship. You can do this without withdrawing from college, until you receive a definite apprenticeship offer. Almost all vacancies can be found on the Government's National Apprenticeship website, where you can search for local and national vacancies and apply: <https://www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/apprenticeshipsearch>
