

Promoting British Values at Lodge Lane Infant School

Respect and Responsibility

- Promoting Respect and responsibility are two of our core values
- School council teams provide opportunities for leadership roles
- Forest School sessions enable children to manage risks responsibly
- School approach to learning and behaviour is underpinned by children taking responsibility for their own decisions and actions
- Training including E-safety, road safety and anti-bullying helps children to develop knowledge to stay safe
- Wider provision - chickens and school awards eg Food for Life, Healthy Schools - maintain the culture which promote this aspects of our values

Celebrating and developing positive attitudes towards diversity

- Promoting *equality* is one of the schools main values
- RE provision and collective worship covers all of the major religions
- Educational visits and visitors provide broader cultural experiences
- Annual disability awareness workshops are provided through links with the charity JUST DIFFERENT
- Participation in National Anti-Bullying week promotes greater understanding towards other people

Democracy

- All members of the school council are democratically elected by their class
- Class rules are developed with children each year
- Approach to learning is underpinned by giving children a voice;
 - Inquiries are co-authored with children
 - Behaviour resolution, peer mediation gives a chance to help shape a resolution
 - Our EYFS curriculum is based on children making their own choices
- Class routines are developed with the children

Personal Qualities

Self-confidence, self-esteem and self-knowledge

- Our established PHSE curriculum is underpinned by Circle Time and our School Council
- Our inquiry-led curriculum is underpinned by the school's values
- As a Prime area of the EYFS curriculum developed personal qualities is a strong focus
- Children's achievements are celebrated promoting an understanding of individual worth
- Established interventions nurture and strengthen personal when children need further support qualities

Impact and contribution to society

- Many events give children to make a positive contribution;
 - Christmas choir visits to day centre and carol singing
 - Local residents join Christmas play rehearsals
 - Our school joins in cluster and county singing festivals
- The school supports local, national and international charities
- Links with a local specialist provision school has created opportunities for children to learn and play together

Understanding of right and wrong, and the rule of law

- The school's values supports a strong moral approach to learning
- The school's behavior policy focuses on developing self-discipline
- Newly established whole school rules underpin our behavior expectations
- We have strong links with our area PCSO who frequently comes in for lunch, assemblies and to read to children
- Links with local churches promote a respect for religions represented locally
