Intent

At our school, we believe that English is the foundation for learning, expression and communication. Our intention is to equip every child with the skills, knowledge and confidence to use language creatively, accurately and purposefully.

Using the Ready, Steady, Write curriculum, we aim to ensure that:

1. Children become enthusiastic, motivated writers.

They understand the power of writing to entertain, inform, persuade, explain and discuss, and they develop pride in their written achievements.

2. Children develop a secure understanding of grammar, vocabulary and authorial techniques.

Intent

This knowledge builds progressively year on year, enabling them to craft writing that is increasingly controlled, precise and imaginative.

3. All children become fluent, independent communicators.

We want them to be able to express themselves with confidence, organise their ideas clearly and write for a range of audiences and purposes.

4. Children develop a lifelong appreciation of stories, language and diverse texts.

Through high-quality model texts, children experience rich language and powerful examples of written craft.

5. Writing supports every child's voice.

English is taught in a way that celebrates creativity, supports diversity and provides all children—including SEND and EAL pupils—with accessible pathways to success.

Implem entation

Our English curriculum is built around the structured, research-informed **Ready**, **Steady**, **Write** approach. This ensures that learning progresses logically, concepts are revisited regularly, and writing is always purposeful.

1. Carefully Sequenced Knowledge Progression

Across all year groups, children follow a clear progression in:

- Grammar (Word, Sentence, Text, Punctuation)
- Narrative structure and composition
- Writing for different purposes
- Vocabulary acquisition and terminology

Each unit builds upon previous learning, ensuring strong foundations.

2. High-Quality Vehicle Texts

Each term is anchored in a rich and engaging text. These texts are selected to:

- model high-level vocabulary and sentence craft
- inspire imagination and discussion
- provide authentic contexts for writing outcomes

3. Explicit Teaching of Writing Purposes

Across the school, children learn how to write:

- Narratives (including myths, flashbacks, dilemmas, dual narratives, setting stories, invention narratives and more)
- Recounts (diaries, newspaper reports, biographies, letters)
- Information texts
- Instructions
- Explanations
- Persuasive texts

Discussions

Each purpose is revisited multiple times, developing sophistication and control.

4. Rigorous Grammar Instruction

Grammar is taught explicitly and applied directly into writing. Children learn to:

- build increasingly complex sentences
- use expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials
- apply cohesive devices within and across paragraphs
- develop accuracy in punctuation, from early capital letters to Year 6 use of semi-colons, colons, dashes and hyphens

5. Consistent Writing Processes

Throughout the school, children are taught to:

- plan
- orally rehearse
- draft
- edit
- publish

They learn how real writers refine and improve their work.

6. Assessment and Feedback

Teachers monitor progress through:

- ongoing formative assessment
- writing checkpoints
