

As this is the last full week of term, we thought we would give you some more open-ended activities so you can have fun and wind down after a very busy year.

Here are some of our suggestions, but we know you will have some brilliant ideas of your own!

- Write a new story about the Egg Box Dragon. Now that Egg Box Dragon has helped the Queen, what might happen to him next? Discuss potential new adventures for Egg Box Dragon. You might use various prompts to support children in developing ideas as a class or in groups: what important item might be lost? Who has lost it? How have they heard about Egg Box Dragon? How do they persuade him to help? Do Emma and her dad go along or are there new characters, or does he go alone?
- Could you do some dragon related art work? Could you paint a picture of a dragon? Could you use Fimo or playdough to create your own dragon? Could you create a picture of a dragon's eye like this one?



Could you use a cardboard box to create a house or bedroom for a dragon? Maybe like this?

- Create a 'Reflections on Lodge Lane' keepsake. You could make a book, a poster, something on the computer/tablet (e.g. PowerPoint or MovieMaker). Reflect on your memories of Lodge Lane and your favourite moments. Or maybe you could make a time capsule to seal and look back at when you're older? You could make one of these for lockdown too, so you can remember it in many years to come!
- Build your own obstacle course and test it out on your family members! You could time them to see how long it takes them, or they could race side-by-side. Can you beat them?
- Choose a country you are interested in. Find out some facts about it. Learn a few words of the language or languages they speak. Make some food from that country.
- Go on a walk and collect some items along your way. Use these to create some artwork eg leaf printing, collage etc.
- Build a den in your house or garden. Make your own lunch and eat it inside the den.
- Create your very own maths board game to play with your family.
- Write your own song or rap! Can you put some music to it?
- Create a new animal (you could use recycled materials, paint one, make one using lego or hama beads etc.) Give it a name and write a fact file about the animal! What does it eat? Where does it live?
