- Two literary texts connected by a theme, e.g. Society and the Individual (The Great Gatsby, F Scott Fitzgerald / Great Expectations, Charles Dickens)
- A variety of non-fiction texts connected to theme above
- 2 pieces of original writing of your choice, supported by a commentary

### Why Study the Subject/what students like about it

A-Level Language & Literature is a new course for Hellesdon Sixth Form.

Students have expressed a wish to continue developing their original writing *as well as* their studies of prose, drama and poetry at A-Level. The Lang/Lit combined course has been introduced to respond to this demand.

The Lang/Lit course provides students with a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts to analyse and re-create. By the end of the course, students will be equipped with the technical language and skills required to understand how writers communicate successfully; students will then apply this skill to creating their own original non-fiction and fiction texts.

### **Opportunities outside the classroom**

Given the range of text types that students will create on the course, we hope to encourage submission to magazines, journals, competitions and newspapers.

In previous years, we have also organised trips to The Globe theatre and to live poetry performances.

### **Future progression/career routes**

The course provides a grounding for either Language or Literature at degree level and is an excellent subject to complement many courses, such as Psychology, Sociology, any media-related course, Communication or Education.
