Long term progression guide

Our long term progression guide shows you what is being covered throughout the year, to give you an overview of what should be taught and when. Time for Phonics is planned so that children start by learning the simplest GPCs and then move on to the more complex correspondences within phase 5. It covers all the main correspondences so that children become confident and effective readers. Children are introduced to the high frequency decodable and tricky words throughout the phases and are given the opportunity to consolidate learning at both the end and beginning of each phase. The scheme progression provides pace and the chance to revisit, review, practise and apply knowledge.

Getting started

NEW We provide one hour of live online training for all new school members, this will show staff how to implement the programme in their setting. This is included within the cost of the Time for Phonics school membership.

NEW on-demand phonics courses

All schools that subscribe to Time for Phonics receive instant access to an on-demand training offer to help get the most out of the membership. Teaching staff will be able to complete the training at a date and time to suit them, and can work through the modules either all in one go, or in smaller bursts. Teaching staff are also able to monitor their own progress through the modules in their account area, and there are quizzes at the end of each module which will help teachers self evaluate their training progress, and repeat any relevant lessons.

The online training is broken down into 2 modules, with each module comprising a number of lessons. The lessons contain a combination of written information and bite-sized videos, to better help teachers digest the learning.
