

Contact Tracing - Half Term

Please see the below message from the DFE:

As lockdown eases, taking a rapid COVID-19 test twice a week, even if you do not have symptoms, will help us stay ahead of the spread of the virus, particularly as new strains appear. Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 have no symptoms and are spreading the virus without knowing. This includes those who have had their vaccine.

We want to thank you for your continued support in testing. Over 40 million tests with staff and students have now been conducted as part of the education testing programme.

Students have been provided with test kits to last throughout half term. Please could students test twice-weekly over half-term and test before returning to school after the holiday. Please remember to log results on the NHS test and trace website and on the school form which can be found [here](#) or on our website. If your child tests positive on an LFD home test kit, please arrange for a PCR test as soon as possible and contact the school. If your child tests positive on or before Monday 31st May please notify Mrs Watts at hwatts@acle.norfolk.sch.uk or ring the out of hours Covid hotline- 07721 332592.

Roots Project

A group of Year 9 students have been representing Acle Academy in a project called Roots over the last five weeks. The students have been matched up with a partner school in Bolton, meeting regularly remotely with a small group of students to exchange experiences.
