#### **Increase in Covid Precautions**

We have seen a sharp increase in the number of coronavirus cases in our local community over half term and as a result have increased our preventative measures in school. In response to rising case numbers we are:

- Deploying CO2 monitors in restricted ventilation areas
- Minimising opportunities for large groupings
- Encouraging more frequent use of sanitiser at the beginning and end of every lesson
- Masks to be worn on school transport
- Reducing opportunities for staff contact
- Encouraging students who wish to wear a mask to do so in social areas
- Increasing cleaning of touch points in classrooms in between lessons.
- Encouraging all staff to test regularly, to minimise the risk of our teachers giving your child or other children Covid;
- Ensuring our staff and children practice good hygiene;
- Making sure our spaces are well ventilated
- Encouraging all members of our community to isolate and book a <u>PCR test</u> should they develop symptoms of the virus.

Please note that some of our bus companies will insist on masks to be worn on their buses and can refuse entry. All students who travel on school transport should carry a mask. Additional home tests are being issued to students next week.

Up to one in three people who have COVID-19 can spread the virus without knowing. This is because they have no symptoms. We are therefore asking all parents to encourage their children to test twice a week to help keep our school open.

If you are unable to work due to your child having, or displaying symptoms of, COVID-19, you may be entitled to a one-off payment of £500 through the <a href="NHS Test and Trace Support Payment scheme">NHS Test and Trace Support Payment scheme</a> if you are required to stay at home and self-isolate.

You will be eligible if you live in England and meet all the following criteria:

- you have been asked to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace, including by the NHS COVID-19 app
- · you are employed or self-employed
- you cannot work from home and will lose income as a result
- you are claiming at least one of the following benefits:
  - 1. Universal Credit
  - 2. Working Tax Credits
  - 3. income-related Employment and Support Allowance
  - 4. income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
  - 5. Income Support
  - 6. Pension Credit or Housing Benefit



# Sad News- Mr Batty, Former HeadteacherAcle Academy

During the half-term break, we received the shocking news that Gerry Batty had suddenly passed away on Sunday 24 October 2021, aged 60.

Gerry was Headteacher at Acle High School from 2003- 2008 and pioneered the Science Specialist status for the school. Gerry was renowned as a passionate and formidable Headteacher who always put children first. Gerry moved on to his second Headship at Hellesdon High School, where he was Headteacher for eleven years. Gerry was the founding CEO of The Wensum Trust, where he continued his career in education until retiring in 2019.

Gerry was paramount in the recovery of Acle Academy in 2016. After the Academy was placed in special measures in 2015 the school experienced great turbulence and the viability of the school was in question. Gerry was approached to help the school during a difficult time. His passionate belief in the school, the community and most importantly the children paved the way for the school's improvement. We will be forever thankful for his unwavering support and dedication to our school community.

## Raising Awareness and Prevention of Online Sexual behaviour- Sex, Likes and Social Media Talking to Teens in the Digital Age

On Monday 15 November, Allison Havey, CEO of the RAP Foundation & co-founder of The RAP Project (Raising Awareness and Prevention), will be coming into school and doing two workshops with our year 10 and 11 students in the afternoon. She will also be providing an information evening for parents at Acle Academy on the evening of Monday 15<sup>th</sup> of November at 6pm, which we would like to extend an invitation out to all our parents of students in year 9-11.

RAP is an organisation delivering RSE and Sexual citizenship workshops to pupils, parents, and teachers in over 260 schools throughout the UK and abroad. Allison is a former international TV news journalist and Deana Puccio, RAP co-founder, is a former sex crimes prosecutor from Brooklyn.

Since establishing The RAP Project in 2012, their core messages have remained the same: Students aged 11-18 should know the legal definitions of sexual offenses; practice 'Mutual Respect and Mutual Consent' and understand how social media and online porn influence attitudes, expectations, and body image- all in an **age-appropriate manner**. They deliver a variety of workshops, from 'Digital Natives', 'Social Skills', 'Altered, Airbrushed and Unrealistic' to 'The Big Leap,' designed for Year 13 pupils about to transition to University, a GAP year, or an apprenticeship. The Parents talk will include elements of all the presentations and aim to inform and empower parents of students aged 11-18. From educating younger pupils on social media, Protecting Privacy and Practicing Discretion and Kindness Online to making informed decisions about Consent, Alcohol, Personal Safety Advice at Parties, On Public Transport and Music Festivals to Being an Active Bystander, we cover a lot of ground. The founders strongly believe that when students and parents both participate in RAP workshops on the same day, a bridge is created allowing for more open discussions about difficult topics.



#### **Big Norfolk Festive Holiday Fun**

The Festive HAF scheme is due to run during the Christmas holidays for 4 days from 20-23rd December for children aged 5-16 who are eligible for free school means. The scheme will combine lots of fun activities to help keep children and young people busy before Christmas.

Good quality textiles are exported to Africa, Asia and Eastern Europe providing quality affordable second hand clothing. Poor quality textiles are cut into industrial wiping cloths. Our rag bag bin is situated in the main corridor and students can drop off donations at any point.

On Tuesday the Year 8/9 football team began their Norfolk County Cup journey with a long awaited trip to Archbishop Sancroft High School.
