What Year 4 will be learning about in the next six weeks

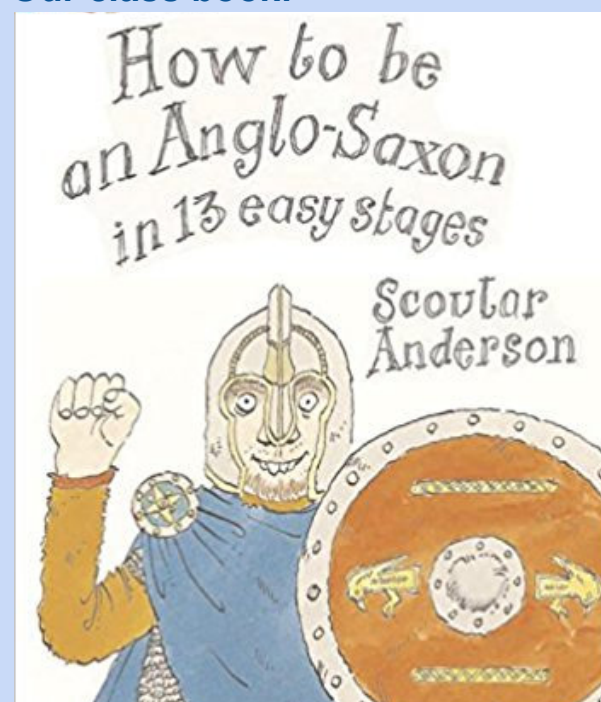
In history lessons, classes will learn all about the Anglo-Saxon and Scots settlement of England. They will learn where the invaders came from and why they invaded England. They will also find out about Anglo-Saxon jobs, art and culture and religion and festivals.



In science, the children will investigate electricity and create their own electrical circuits. In art, we will complete a study of Paul Cezanne and have a go at creating our own impressionist artwork.
