St Nicholas Church have been successful in obtaining funding from the National Lottery Heritage Fund to conserve the building and grounds and working with Alderman Peel High School to offer opportunities to students e.g. work experience, Careers Ambition Days for students and enhance learning and skills through partnership with the church.

The Year 10/11 Achieve students are currently working on a Unit of work called Work Experience. The students have started conservation of the outdoor areas, by removing the autumn leaves ensures that wild flowers/bulbs can thrive in the conservation areas of the church yard. ## Y9,10 and 11 Theatre Visit 'Bobby & Amy'

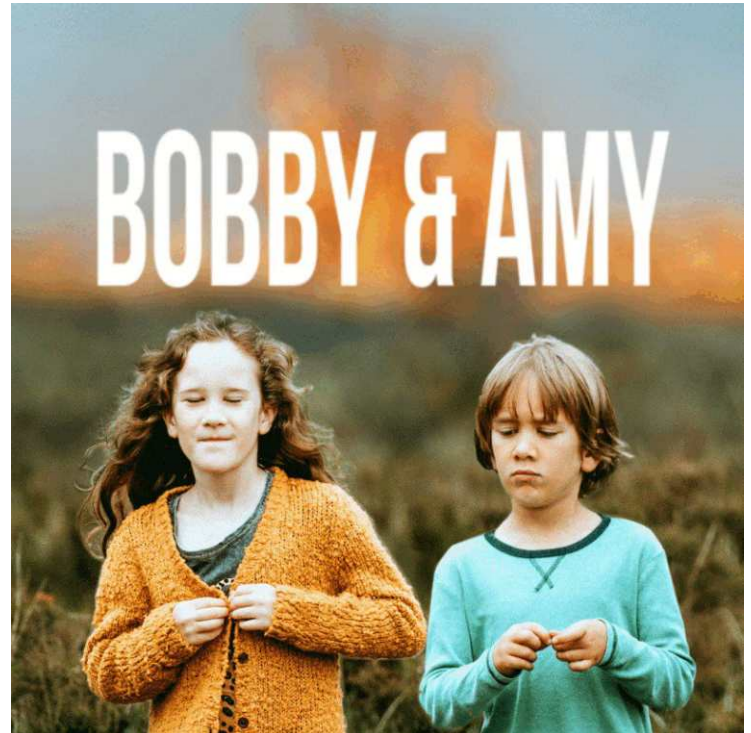
On the Friday 27th of November, I was lucky enough to attend a production of a brilliant play, 'Bobby and Amy', in the Wells Maltings theatre.

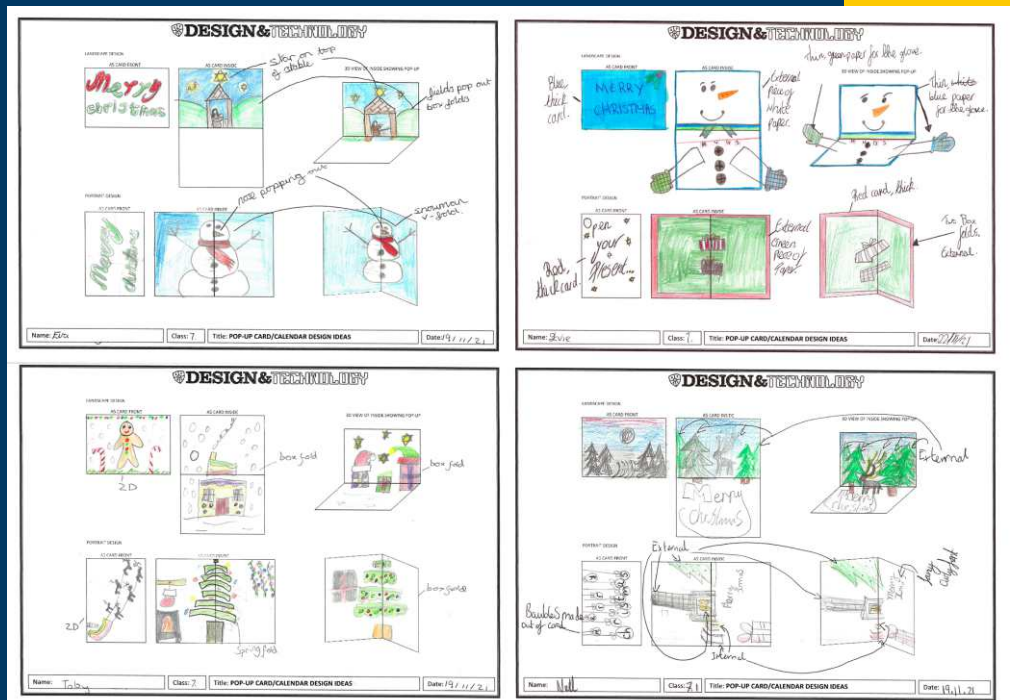


## KS3

Since starting their D&T journey at APHS, the Year 7 students have been learning about typography and the importance of choosing the right fonts as a graphic designer. Their first task was to design their own logo for a business card that represented themselves and their interests (taking inspiration from Google Doodles), which resulted in some very creative results like these great examples by Luke, Alex, Tommy, Lily, Ziggi and Finley!

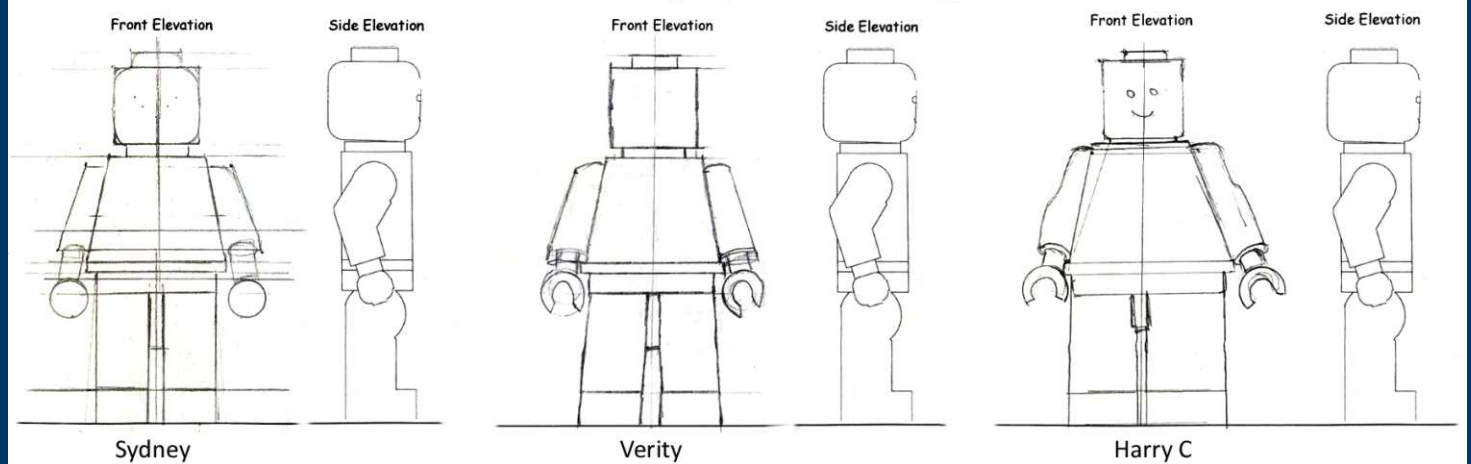


Following on from this unit, the Year 7s are currently learning about how to make the two basic pop-up mechanisms (a box and v-fold) in order to design and make a pop-up card or calendar. Well done to Eva, Evie, Toby and Nell for these excellent examples of how to produce creative, well drawn and clearly annotated design ideas. We look forward to seeing the finished pop-up cards, just in time for Christmas!

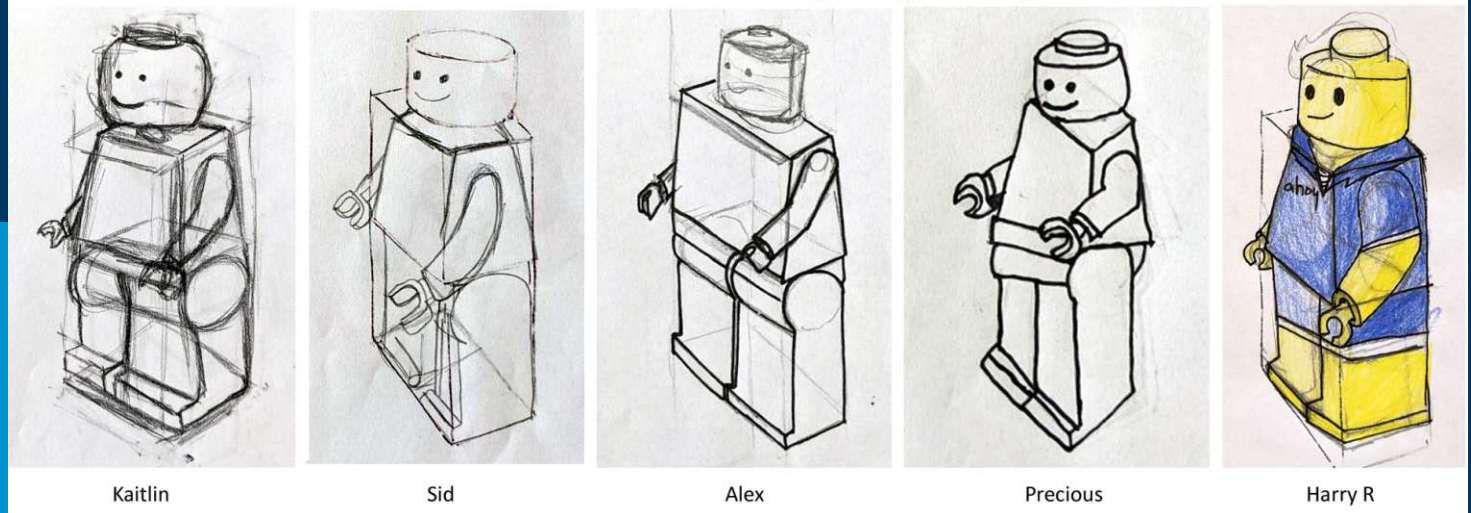


Year 8 and 9 have been focusing on learning a range of drawing techniques to be able to communicate their design ideas. Lego has been the theme for this unit and there has been some excellent individual technical drawing skills demonstrated. In particular, Sydney, Verity and Harry C who used a set square and a drawing board to draw accurate front elevations to complete their orthographic drawings, Kaitlin, Sid, Alex, Precious and Harry R who used the 'crating' technique to ensure their 3D freehand sketches had the correct angles and proportions, and Eva, Eden and Selin who drew excellent 3D drawings using isometric grid paper.

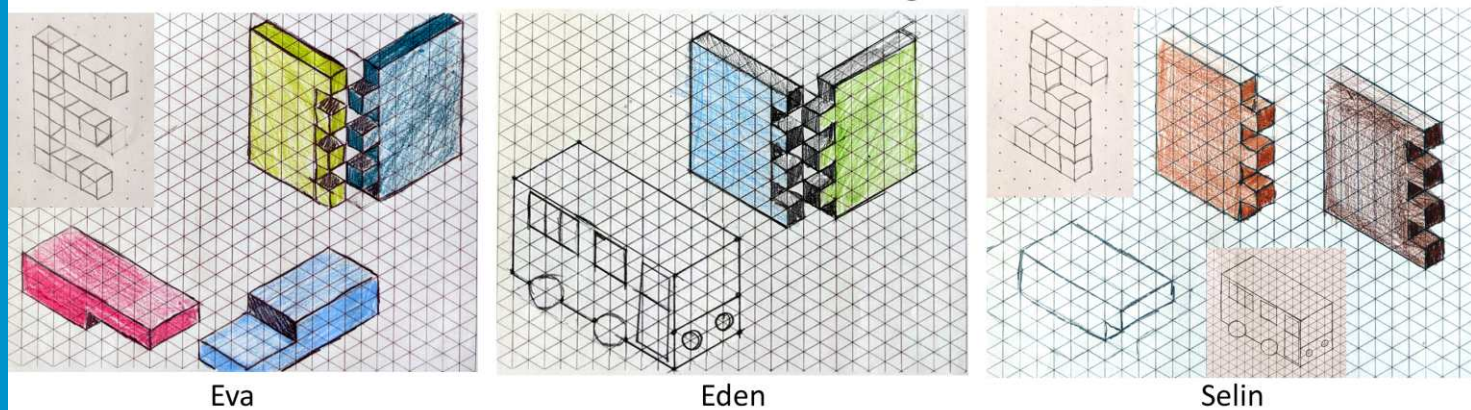
## 2D orthographic drawing

## STOP THE PRESS!

As part of our whole school focus on encouraging all students to read, we have been sharing interesting news articles related to D&T in the KS3 Google Classrooms each week. Example topics include 'Dog saving drones!', 'Nike basketball courts made from recycled trainers', Fully 3D printed shoes', 'Wearable tech 'jacket' you can drive!' Please encourage students to read these to learn more about how D&T will be shaping their future! We also have a new book case in D&T with lots of interesting titles so be sure to check it out!



## KS4

Year 10 have made a great start to their GCSE course learning about their first topic 'New and Emerging Technologies', which includes how jobs roles and production techniques have changed due to advances in automation, robotics and communication technology. Linked to this topic, their first 'Production Challenge' was to make as many paper cars like the one pictured in 45 minutes!



The girl's team quickly assigned roles and formed an assembly line to speed up batch production. Meanwhile, the boy's team opted to create a more bespoke method of manufacture with each of them creating an individual car. Needless to say, the girls won the challenge but credit has to go to the boys for creativity - none of their cars were the same!

Following on from this, the Year 10's 'Enterprise Challenge' was to design and make a range of products using recycled bottle tops to be sold during 'Global Entrepreneurship Week'. The winning team is the one that makes the most profit and they will get to choose which charity all the profits will go to!



Here are a selection of their awesome product ranges which are unsurprisingly selling like hot cakes! I'm so proud of the creativity and commitment demonstrated by both teams ('Crafty Devils' and 'LCM Crafts') who are working tirelessly during lunchtimes and after school to fulfil orders. They are clearly young entrepreneurs of the future! Watch this space to find out which team is triumphant!





Year 11 are busy working on their GCSE coursework project (worth 50%) to design and make a product on the theme of 'Outdoor Living'. It is vital that students stay on top of this work and catch-up if they miss any lessons or their work is incomplete.

To prepare for their final AQA D&T GCSE exam (worth 50%) in May, I have provided students with a Personal Learning Checklist (PLC) linked to AQA D&T Collins Revision Guide and recommended that students read a double page spread each week and create a simplified version of revision sketches and/or notes on one side of A4. There are 30 double pages in the revision guide so if they revise one a week throughout Y11 they will have read the whole book by the time of the exam! Please encourage them to keep up to date with this revision homework.

Want to take part in fun and challenging activities to improve your science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) skills. Then STEM Club is for you!

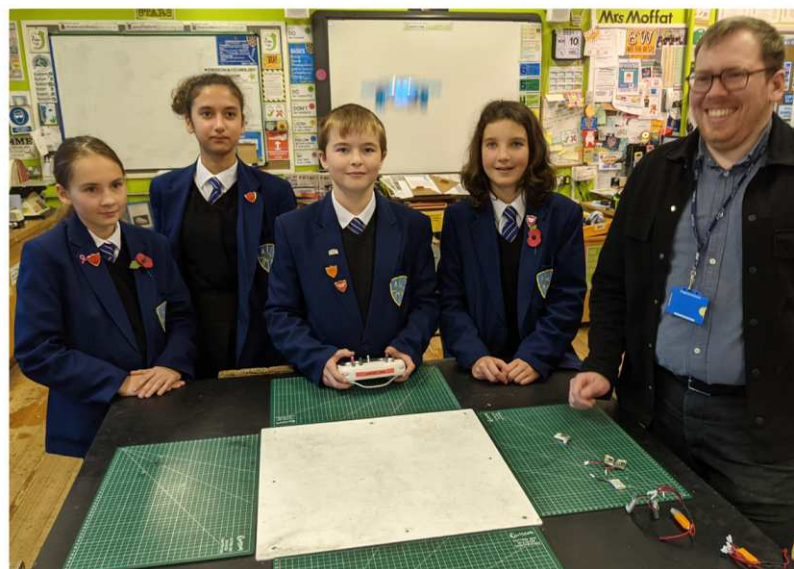
Oliver (Y8) is currently sharing his programming expertise using Scratch to help his peers to code their own computer games – most notably, Mallory's cool Dr Who game!

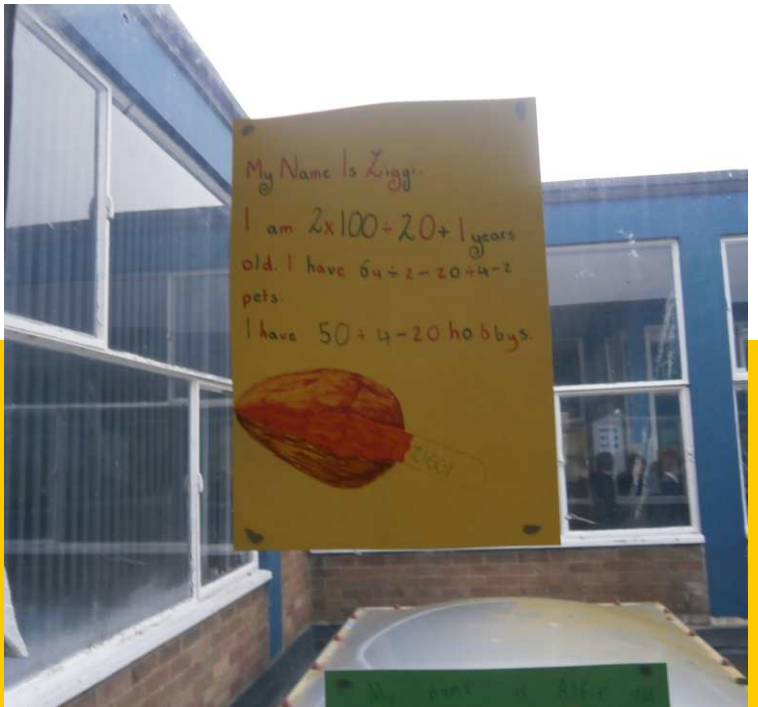
