Scopay

Scopay will no longer be using WorldPay to process any payment, they are now going to be providing this service directly. You may notice that you are redirected to a different third party portal.

Free School Meal Breakfast

We are now offering all of our students who are in receipt of Free School Meals, a free breakfast in addition to the free school meal at lunch time. Students will receive a hot roll or muffin, hash brown and a fruit juice or hot drink.

Contacting your child during the school day

Please can we ask all parents to avoid texting your child during the school day. If you need to get a message to your child, please contact the school office and we will make sure the message is passed on. Students are not allowed to use their phones whilst at school.

What to do if your 12-15 year-old child missed their appointment at school to receive their Covid vaccination

If for any reason your child missed the opportunity to receive their vaccination at school, or were declined their vaccination because they tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 12 weeks, you have the following alternative options. You will need to accompany your child to any venues offering the vaccination to give consent:

Booking vaccination appointments online

You can book your child's 1st dose online from the day they turn 12. You can usually book their 2nd dose from 24 hours after they had their 1st dose. You'll be offered appointment dates from 12 weeks after their 1st dose. Book a COVID-19 vaccination appointment

Getting the vaccine at a walk-in vaccination site.

Your child can get a 1st dose at a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site from the day they turn 12. They can get a 2nd dose if it's been 12 weeks since their 1st dose. Find a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site

Household Support Fund

The government has made funds available to provide vulnerable households in most need of support; who would otherwise struggle to buy food or pay essential utility bills, or meet other essential living costs this winter as the economy recover. Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test</u> and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Message from the Attendance Officer

When notified of a Covid Absence Mrs Bryant will prepopulate the register for the first 5 days. From day 6 onwards please report the absence daily to confirm that your child is still testing positive on LFD.

In order to return to school on day 6 the LFD tests will need to be taken early in the morning on day 5 and 6 as they must be 24 hours apart.

For clarification the day of the positive result is counted as day ZERO.



Social Media

This week in assembly, we have been focusing on the effects of social media on society and ourselves. Students have been reminded about the importance of not accepting friend requests from people they do not personally know and the importance of ensuring that they think about everything they post online before they post it. We have also considered some of the effects of over use of social media.

Students have been reminded about:

- Not taking their mobile phones to bed-leave in another room or hand to parents
- Use the Granny test (if you would not say it in front of Grandma-don't post it)
- Never post emotionally- take a breath and pause
- Not to believe everything they see or read
- Remember that people only post what they want others to see, images are manipulated- social media is not an accurate reflection of other's lives
- The importance of maintaining a good online reputation
- Privacy settings
- Strategies to reduce time online and spend more time with family and friends
