We Stand With Ukraine

As we watch with horror the shocking news of the Ukraine invasion this week, we have all felt moved. It has been very hard to think about our normal lives when so many people have had their world turned upside down. As a school, we have focused on educating children about the historical context and the facts. Many students are worried and we know that social media can report misinformation. Therefore we have adjusted our curriculum this week to ensure that all children have been taught the verified facts from trustworthy sources. We have encouraged students to understand that this conflict is not created by the ordinary people of Russia and therefore we should not discriminate.

On Thursday 3[∞] March we showed our support for the people of Ukraine by supporting a nonuniform day by wearing yellow and blue to raise awareness for the people of the Ukraine and to raise money for UNICEF. We also made and gave out 600 Ukrainian solidarity ribbons to show our support for this important cause. As a school, we stood together and observed a minutes silence for all people who have been affected by the war in Ukraine.

More importantly, we have focused this World Book Day on the experience of war and conflict. Across the school we have read extracts from texts that focus on the experience of children during conflict. We have explained the historical context of the differing conflicts and students have had the opportunity to explore parallels between events and develop empathy for those that suddenly find themselves having to survive during war. International Women's Day

This week we have been celebrating International Women's Day and Mr Sayce has shared a very powerful assembly. He has focused on the importance of recognising that gender equality is still not achieved across the world and that there is still work to be done, particularly in the spheres of economics and politics. Mr Sayce also emphasised that as a school community students can do more to challenge inappropriate language and bias when they hear it. To help celebrate Women's History Month Students will learn about pioneering women throughout history and Mr Sayce has launched a competition to design a poster to highlight women's achievements in history.

Chris Page ITV Anglia Weather Visits Year 8 Geography

Chris Page from ITV Anglia visited Y8 geography with Miss Burdett on Thursday 24th February. Chris spoke about careers using Geography and his career path in meteorology to his current job as the ITV weather presenter and forecaster for the Anglian region. He then looked at measuring weather, weather characteristics and forecasting using up to date computer, satellite programs and images, explaining how these images and data are used and put into a forecast. He linked it back to the three named storms of Dudley, Eunice and Franklin and how they were tracked & forecast.

The students had plenty of questions regarding weather, climate and climate change. The weather also played ball with rain, snow and sunshine occurring all in that afternoon, so who could ask for more? Fingers crossed we can do a return trip to the ITV studios in Norwich to make our own weather broadcast. Many Thanks to Chris for giving up his time to work with year 8.





Year 10 Careers Day

Last week year 10 took part in a Careers Drop Down day, where they had the chance to meet employers from different sectors. Representatives from Norwich City Football club, Oyster Yachts, an interior design company, Adnams, a social media entrepreneur, and Chris Page from ITV weather came to share their industry experiences.

The students worked hard and learnt about all the different roles available within the sectors, including some that none of us had considered! The students thought about all the different skills needed within employment and really enjoyed the interactive aspects of the sessions. Students had a chance to get creative and design their own interior design flat boards, listen to industry experts

and discuss career options. The year 10s asked some excellent questions to the visitors and were a real credit to the school, our visitors were really impressed! Miss Cunliffe- Careers Coordinator.





Living with Covid- update

Although many of the specific COVID-19 laws have changed, the public health guidance remains largely unchanged. The principles of hands, face, space and fresh air remain key to infection control, and we continue to ask people to act responsibly by staying at home and away from others if they have symptoms or test positive for COVID-19. When a pupil, staff or other adult develops <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u> or has a positive test they should follow the guidance <u>People with COVID-19 and their contacts</u> which advises;

"Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. They should follow the guidance for their educational setting."

We have a responsibility under the existing Public Health Laws and Health Protection Regulations to respond appropriately to all infectious diseases (e.g. Mumps, Measles, Rubella, and COVID-19). We do this by making sure we follow published guidance and have in place risk assessments and Health and Safety policies. Therefore, in line with our risk assessment and related policies, children and young people who test positive or have symptoms of COVID-19 must stay at home as per the published guidance.

Good quality textiles are exported to Africa, Asia and Eastern Europe providing quality affordable second hand clothing. Poor quality textiles are cut into industrial wiping cloths. Our rag bag bin is situated in the main corridor and students can drop off donations at any point.


