Changes to Covid Regulations from the 1st April 2022

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the <u>next steps for living with COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April. Free COVID-19 tests will continue to be available for specific groups, including eligible patients and NHS staff, once the universal testing offer ends on Friday 1 April. Updated guidance will advise:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days

Will my child's school or college still be taking measures to prevent Covid?

All settings should have in place baseline infection prevention and control measures that will help to manage the spread of infection:

- Ensuring all eligible groups are enabled and supported to take up the offer of national vaccination programmes including COVID-19 and flu.
- Ensuring occupied spaces are well-ventilated and let fresh air in.
- Reinforcing good hygiene practices such as hand washing and cleaning.

Can my child still get a Covid-19 vaccine?

From 1st April the in-school COVID-19 vaccination programme will come to an end. However, **12 to 15 year olds will still be able to access the vaccine outside of schools at a vaccination centre, pharmacy or walk-in centre**. Parents can book a <u>Covid-19 vaccination</u> appointment online or by speaking to their GP or calling 119. Alternatively, they can find a <u>walk-in Covid-19 vaccination site</u>.

From April, healthy 5-11 year olds will also be offered the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccinations will take place outside of schools in vaccination centres, pharmacies, GPs and walk-in centres. Parents of 5-11 year olds will receive a letter from the NHS with further information. <u>Online bookings</u> for 5-11 year olds will open in April.



This week we have been celebrating Autism Acceptance Week. Students have been learning more about how autism affects people and how to help support people with autism. Edward Sparkes in Year 9 created an informative PowerPoint which was shared across the school and we also raised money for the National Autism society through a non-uniform day and cake sale.

In addition, we have held a training session for 18 students from Years 7- 10 who were trained by an autism specialist to become Autism Ambassadors.

Therapy Dogs

The therapy dogs continue to be a hit with students in Inspire. They visit every Wednesday morning and we now offer sessions where students read to the dogs. This is proven to improve students' confidence with reading.
