On Wednesday 4th May, the U16 rugby team travelled to North Walsham RFC to play on the first team pitch against Framingham Earl in the Norfolk Bowl final. Many staff and students attended after the school provided a coach for them to spectate, which created a great atmosphere. Acle started very well and their opposition had to defend in the opening part of the game. The pressure told though, as from the breakdown, a fantastic miss pass by Thomas M created the overload with ball reaching Josh to score on the wide left.

Acle then went up the other end, and from a great passing move, Seb E powered over the line to score on the right for a penalty try.

Soon after, Acle extended their advantage after some clever play from Seb S. Quick thinking from a penalty saw a tap and go and the he bundled the ball over the line underneath theposts. Conner kicked the resulting conversion. # **Norfolk Community Youth Forum**

Working in partnership the Norfolk Independent Advisory Group (IAG) and Norfolk PCC Youth Commission would like to provide an opportunity for young people across Norfolk to have their say and voice their concerns on Police and Crime. This is the first of its kind in Norfolk, with young people and professionals invited to come along and discuss policing and crime issues affecting young people directly with members of Norfolk Constabulary and the Police and Crime Commissioner himself.

These could be concerns around specific issues relevant to young people that you feel are not being addressed, or could be wider concerns about police policy that is having an adverse effect on young people.

The forum will recruit as many young people and professionals to join a mailing list, which will act as the medium by which meetings will be announced (they will be held by Teams bimonthly) and the medium by which the actions taken from concerns raised at meetings will be communicated. There will also be an opportunity to, via the mailing list, submit issues for discussion anonymously.

The first forum is scheduled to be held on **Thursday 12th May from 5-6pm**.
