#### **Global Underwater Hub STEM Challenge- Mr Southerden**


On Friday 20th May, six Year 9 students participated in the Global Underwater Hub STEM challenge at the Space in Norwich. This year's challenge was to design, build, program and market a Remotely Operated Underwater Vehicle (ROV) in under 6 hours. The team worked exceptionally well taking on different roles to overcome a series of challenges and activities. Their ROV; named Serenity, was capable of navigating a complex course through coral reef to survey litter and environmental impact using a variety of sensors. The team ended the day with a pitch delivered to other schools from East Anglia and industry professionals. Many staff remarked on how fantastic their ideas and delivery were. Sadly the team was not successful in progressing to the national finals this year but hopes are high for our next STEM challenge. The team wishes to offer congratulations and the best of luck to Alderman Peel High School (part of the Wensum Trust Family) as they progress on to Aberdeen.



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### **Aspire 9**

A group of our Year 10 pupils have recently commenced their work as part of our Aspire 9 group. The core focus of this project is to help and support these pupils as they aim to achieve three grade 9s in their 'Golden' subjects. We will be working closely with these pupils as they are each assigned an academic mentor who will act as their link in assisting them with academic targets and goal setting over the coming months. We'll also have many exciting opportunities for them to engage with content and extra-curricular activities linked to their aspirations for the future.

We will also look to further develop our academic mentoring support with more Year 10 pupils after the Year 11 exams as we aim to best prepare the pupils for their final GCSE year.



#### **Year 8 Stretch Group**

We have recently launched our Year 8 Stretch sessions which aim to; expand study and higher-order thinking skills, develop and enhance academic vocabulary, and engage students with creative content in order to inspire passion for learning. This project which takes place during form time will see Mr Sayce work with these pupils and combines a mixture of lecture based topics, academic debates and independent research assignments to engage pupils with materials which will really help them develop their academic skillset and enhance their passion for learning.
