Welcome to the New School Year

Welcome to the first newsletter of the academic year. It has been a great start to the new school year and students have settled back into the routines of school life quickly. It is a delight to see all the Year Sevens settling in so well and adjusting to life at High School. I hope you all had a wonderful summer with your families.

We are all very proud of the fantastic achievements of Year 11's 2022 who achieved a great set of results and the highest academic performance we have seen as a school in six years. Students across the cohort made excellent progress against their targets. Our results show that students made on average half a GCSE grade improvement across all of their subjects in comparison with their target grades- this is a superb achievement for the students and for all the staff who supported them.

This year we hope to continue to build on the academic successes of last year. As an Ofsted rated 'Good' school that is now oversubscribed, we are delighted with the progress the school has made. Our development priorities for this year are focused around three main areas:

- Helping to improve the literacy skills of all learners especially in terms of developing their vocabulary and confidence in speaking in a range of formal and informal contexts. These are important skills which will not only contribute to academic success, but also help prepare students for life after school and develop their employability skills.
- 2. Helping students to regulate their own emotions, build resilience and further develop empathy and respect for others through deploying emotion coaching strategies to help improve mental health and wellbeing.
- 3. Creating more opportunities across the curriculum for active and independent learning with a particular focus of looking beyond the classroom and making links to the wider world and careers.

We are always looking for opportunities to expand the horizons for our students and would love to hear from parents, carers or members of the community who may like to work with us to support our students. We are particularly interested in providing opportunities for students to gain insights into the world of work. If you think you could help work with us on a project or visit, we would love to hear from you.



We welcomed over 200 Year 6 students from a range of local primary schools who all enjoyed taster sessions in History, Geography, French and German. Rewards lunches- Week commencing 26th September

We look forward to celebrating the achievements of our pupils next week beginning on Monday 26th September. We have reflected upon their end of July tracking and have analysed their progress and want to reward pupils who have achieved high ATLs (Attitude to Learning). We will be holding rewards lunches on the below days for all pupils in the 'top 25' ATLs within each year group. We will also be rewarding pupils who have seen significant improvements in their ATLs. Having a high ATL is crucial to academic success and the two are irrevocably linked. Well done to all pupils we will be celebrating lunch with next week. Homework

We have recently implemented our new model of setting all homework for pupils on a Monday morning in a bid to help them with their organisational skills. This has started really well and we are very impressed with the feedback we are receiving from parents and pupils alike. I'd like to remind pupils that the best thing to do with homework now is to plan out the week ahead on a Monday evening so that they know the schedule for the rest of their week. If pupils are struggling to plan their homework schedule, then we will be offering prefect-led sessions with the study support team in the Library every Tuesday lunchtime. They will be on hand to offer support and guidance on how to best manage homework schedules. We also offer a homework club every Tuesday and Thursday and there are staff on hand to support pupils with their homework on these days. We just ask that all pupils sign up for the late bus by 1:30pm on the day.

GCSE Information Evening

Just a reminder that we will be holding our GCSE Information Evening on Thursday 29th September. This will run from 6pm-7pm and will be a good opportunity to learn more about the GCSE courses and how parents can support pupils with these. There will also be an opportunity to buy revision guides and speak to senior members of staff if there are any individual queries. A letter and ClassCharts announcement has also been sent home with more details on this.

GCSE Revision Cards- monitoring and supporting Year 11 with revision

We are now following up on the summer revision project which all year 11 pupils should have worked on over the holiday. As part of this, we are asking them to get their revision loyalty card signed off by their teachers and then their form tutor will check this formally next week (Thursday 29th September).

This revision loyalty card was part of their summer pack and all form tutors have spare copies if your child has misplaced their one.

It is really important that all pupils take responsibility for their independent revision and get their loyalty cards signed off by their teachers or form tutors. They need to show their teachers/form tutor what they have completed, e.g. past papers, revision notes, flashcards, mind-maps, GCSEPod videos etc. and for each hour's worth of revision they have produced they get a square signed off on their card. This also encourages them to complete what we call 'active revision' which involves not simply re-reading notes or revision guides and instead they need to do something active with this material.

Can parents/carers please continue to support us with this process and have a conversation with your child about this and remind them that we will be doing a form check next week. Please encourage them to talk with their teachers about getting their revision checked. This is incredibly useful in many ways as it not only allows them to get their revision checked and promotes good communication in the lead up to the exams but it also gives myself and Miss John good oversight of their progress and work-rate in preparing for the rigours and demands of Year 11.

Following the first formal check next week we can then see who has been working incredibly hard and put in rewards to celebrate their determination and achievements. Equally, we'll know who hasn't been revising and we can then communicate with parents/carers to see how we can support them and move their revision forward constructively.

Year 11 Post 16 Options

Year 11 students are currently preparing for their next steps; they are being informed of their post-16 options via CC lessons, assemblies and their tutorial sessions. They will be given the opportunity to explore their choices which include traditional A-levels, Vocational qualifications and Apprenticeships – all being offered from a number of local providers. All Year 11 students are in the process of having one to one career meetings with our career's advisor, who will offer them impartial advice and will guide them through any difficulties they might be facing. If they feel that they need a meeting more urgently and have not yet had one, please advise them to speak to Ms Cunliffe, our Careers Coordinator and this can be arranged.

In addition to this support, it is crucial that your child visits prospective colleges during their open events which will be happening over the coming weeks. Dates for open events can be found on the relevant college's website and students will also be provided with a full list of open events provided by local providers. **Some colleges require you to register online before attending so please check in advance.** Many colleges' application processes are now open, with the majority of deadlines at the end of January 2023, so please encourage your child to begin actively preparing themselves for this next step.

Both Ms Skarin (Careers Lead) and Ms Cunliffe (Careers Coordinator) will be available on the KS4 information evening on the 29th Sept, where we will also do a short presentation on Post 16 transition.

The National Tutoring Programme

We are taking part in the DFE National Tutoring Programme and are very fortunate to be able to retain the skills of Mr Freeman who is conducting Maths intervention tutoring sessions within school. Private tuition in Maths outside of school is a very expensive luxury, so we are delighted to be able to offer this service to students within school. Mr Freeman will be tutoring students in small groups of three for an hour a week for 15 weeks. Students across Years 8-11 have been identified by our Maths Department and have commenced tuition. Emotion Coaching update from Mr Bliss

As part of the school's continued commitment to a more child centred, emotion regulation focussed approach to behaviour and wellbeing, we were delighted to be able to welcome John Drew from Emotion Coaching UK for a two day visit prior to the summer holidays. The school has been working closely with Emotion Coaching UK now for a number of years in an effort to try and ensure that we are utilising the latest research and expertise from professionals in the field of child psychology to help change the ethos and culture of the school to ensure that all of the children's experiences are a positive one, regardless of background or circumstance.

John spent two days working closely with the Pastoral staff, leading some training for our exceptional Student Emotion Coaching Ambassadors and working within our Reflection Room. This was a great opportunity for the school to conduct a progress check on ourselves as well as review our pastoral approaches. John was able to give some really valuable insight into the incredible work that has already taken place as well as help to clearly identify a route through the work that is still to be done.

We look forward to being able to welcome him back again at some point this academic year to be able to show him once again the considerable strides we are making as a school, trying to be a leading light in reforming the way that education manages children and their behaviour.

Junior Prefects- Mr Sayce

We will be launching our Junior prefect process starting next week, 26th September. All pupils in Year 7-9 will have assemblies with Mr Sayce whereby we will outline how they can apply to be a junior prefect. This will link to our wider school work with our service areas and we encourage all pupils to consider applying to be a junior prefect as it represents an excellent opportunity to demonstrate leadership skills alongside representing their school.




Costume / Props: Community Plea from Mr Frost
