For that reason, we strongly recommend pupils engage with GCSEPod on a regular basis to complete independent revision for their GCSEs. A big congratulations to all our September top revisers who include Ben S (not pictured) who watched the most Pods in September for Year 10 and to Chloe Day who completed the most Check and Challenge questions. Sam H and Zak each watched over 160 pods in September and should be proud of their revision work. Oliver M was the Year 11 pupil who completed the most Check and Challenge questions clocking in over 253 diamonds (correct answers). Well done to all of you and we'll be celebrating all revision successes very soon and they'll be more GCSEPod prizes in October!



Homework

We're really pleased with how the new homework system is being implemented and how the pupils are responding to their study skills. They are starting to become much more apt at planning for the week ahead as a result of the Monday homework drop. We want to help them continue to reduce the amount of missed homework deadlines and interventions put in place for all pupils.

By dropping all homework for the week on a Monday this now means that your child can plan their week on a Monday evening and avoid any last minute stresses with unexpected homework coming up when they have other plans. Equally, we made this change to support parents/carers as it now enables you to have those conversations with your child at home on Monday evening and you don't need to worry about your child being set more work as the week progresses.

Equally, we have Homework Club on both a Tuesday and Thursday after-school in Room 9 which is staff led and offers bespoke help to pupils with their homework. We also have the senior prefects leading 'study planning sessions' every Tuesday lunchtime in the library. They are on hand to help any students draw up a plan for the week to manage their homework. We have previously posted the 'weekly planner' sheet and have given these to all pupils. We are also able to hand out more of these in form time every Monday and your child will simply have to ask their form tutor if they would like one of these.

Please all find an editable digital copy of the weekly planner attached in the newsletter. This can be used by your child at home to plan their week ahead of time. If you would like these printed for your child then please ask them **to** speak to their form tutor. If you have any questions about the homework policy or would like to discuss this further then I encourage you to get in touch with your child's form tutor or Head of Year.

GCSE Information Evening

Many thanks to all the parents/carers and pupils who attended our GCSE Information Evening. It was wonderful to see so many people from our extended community come together to learn more about your child's GCSEs. 
GCSE Revision Cards- monitoring and supporting Year 11 with revision

We've had a really positive response from Year 11 to our revision monitoring scheme so far. It is clear that so many pupils have really been engaging positively with their revision. We encourage them to make sure that this is a regular part of their study schedule and they should be building in time for independent revision at home. This is best served if the revision is 'active' and involves them working with the material, either creating resources such as mind-maps, flash-cards or Cornell notes. Alternatively, I do recommend they practice past exam papers as this is one of the most efficient ways to revise. Cognitive science has proven that these forms of revision are far more effective than 'passive' revision such as simply re-reading or highlighting text.

As their parents/carers, can I please just ask that you have frequent conversations about revision with your child and remind them to get their revision card signed off by their teachers and checked by their form tutor. We still have a minority of pupils who have yet to get any hours signed off and we are putting measures in place to support them. More importantly, I will begin rewarding those pupils who have been working hard next week and they can expect a variety of small rewards for every 10 hours of revision they complete.

The Power Hour method of revision explained:

This is a highly effective but under used method of revising. It covers all aspects of essential revision. By completing a power hour you will revise a topic, practice an exam question, understand a mark scheme and gain feedback from your teacher.



Junior Prefects

We launched our Junior Prefect application process with pupils in Year 7-9 last week and we have had an amazingly positive response from pupils who have applied in their masses to be prefects. It's a real testament to their sense of community spirit and high aspirations that we have had so many put themselves forward for the application process. The Senior Leadership Team will be looking at applications next week and a decision on the final selection will take place after group interviews and a team-building exercise. Expect to hear a final announcement on our selection of junior prefects before half-term.

Length of skirts

Jim Agnew Memorial Charity

Jim Agnew Memorial Charity (jimagnewcharity.org)

A new source of help is at hand for young people who are struggling to find their feet in life. A charity has been launched recently in the name of farmer Jim Agnew, who died in November 2020. Mr Agnew was a magistrate who worked with children who came into contact with the Youth Justice System.

The idea for the charity came about after Mr Agnew's death, when his many relatives and friends gave generously to the Aylsham Rotary Club in his memory. The club worked with Mr Agnew's family to develop the idea of a charity, so that the donated money could be used for a cause close to his heart. The charity will act as a resource for young people who are struggling and will primarily offer small grants for essential items and activities that will help them to remain in their chosen education, training or work setting.

Both the Youth Offending Team at Norfolk County Council and the Benjamin Foundation were consulted and they were clear that there is a gap in their provision. There are various areas of support that they can provide but other areas where they cannot help because either they do not have the funding or , with the latter organisation, certain activities do not fit with their charitable status.

Young people up to the age of 21 living and studying in Broadland and the North Norfolk council districts, who can demonstrate a need, can apply for support grants. There is no lower age limit.
