Attendance

Every school in the country is set an attendance target by the Department for Education -96% attendance. They also set a persistent absence target of 5% of the whole school. A pupil is classed as persistently absence if their overall absence rate is 10% or higher of the possible number of sessions.

Our attendance for the autumn term was 94% and our persistent absence was 18%. Our attendance has improved and I am very pleased that we are now very close to the DfE target. Persistent absence, although still high, is showing signs of improvement. I look forward to working with you all to make sure that the school meets its targets by the end of the school year.

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Year Group News

Year 3

The Year 3 pupils have returned to school fully refreshed from their Christmas holiday and are already fully engaged in their learning activities. We have seen some fantastic holiday challenge Egyptian pieces from some children and there is still time to bring these in to be displayed in the classrooms and each child will be awarded with 50 class chart points. This half term we are studying ancient Egypt in our History lessons, which the children are thoroughly enjoyed and we're sure they will share lots of fabulous facts with you. We are all looking forward to welcoming Lorraine Theobald to teach us more about the Egyptians and even some dance moves in a few weeks' time. During English lessons we have been completing lots of comprehension lessons around our class reader 'Flat Stanley and the Great Egyptian Grave Robbery' in which the children have made lots of predictions about how the adventure story will continue and conclude. They will want to read more books about Flat Stanley's adventures. In Science we have moved on to learning about 'Light' and hope the sun puts in an appearance so we can look at shadows in the playground. It is really important that all children are engaging with Times Table Rock Stars to improve their speed and fluency, which will inevitably support their daily arithmetic questions.

Year 4

Welcome back to school, we hope you all had a relaxed Christmas. Over the last week, the children have been excited to come back to start their learning of new topics.

In English, we have started looking at our two class books; Fair Trade Frist by Sarah Ridley and The Sword in the Stone by T.H White, whilst in Maths, the children have been practicing for their times tables assessments and we have seen brilliant progress from lots of practice at home and school.

In science this term the children will be focusing on Electricity. We have started to look at electrical safety and we can't wait to bolt into circuits. Finally, we have started looking at fair trade and the progress of food as it makes its way from field to fork.

In Maths, we have moved on to multiplying 2 digit numbers by other 2 digit numbers. It has been a challenge to grasp the concept and all the stages in the method but we have been thrilled to see so much effort and determination from everybody in Year 5!

We would like to say a big 'Well done' to all of Year 5 for their efforts and hard work.

It has been wonderful to welcome the children back after their Christmas holidays and we have all been very impressed with positive manner in which they have approached their learning opportunities and challenges.
