
Celebrating Achievements

Jasper T- superb practice for his final practical




Oscar R - This rounds' winner for his superb response to the WW1 Trenches Shoe Box Challenge in History

World Book Day was on Thursday 2nd March. The day was marked in several ways:

- Staff shared their favourite books at the start of lessons!
- A £1 digital book token will be issued which you can use to buy one of the several specially published books for World Book Day, or get a £1 off the purchase price of any other book, at participating shops!
- The library was open at lunchtime exclusively for quiet reading!

There are also two other ways you can get involved:

- Design-a-bookmark competition: we had some great entries in last year's competition, with two bookmark designs chosen to be professionally printed for use in school. Please see your English teacher for the bookmark template if you'd like to enter a design for this year's competition!
- National Book Token Competition: Your chance to create and design the artwork that will adorn the front of national book token gift cards. 
