
#### A few other nominations

# **Young Carer National Action Day**

This week's Personal Development session in form time focused around National Carers Action Day, which is celebrated nationally on the 15<sup>th</sup> March. This year's theme was '*Make Time for Young Carers'*. The aim is to make our students aware what it means to be a young carer and how we as a school can help and support our young carers. We are collaborating with Caring Together, who is running an awareness project across Norfolk raising awareness and support for young carers. This partnership involves assemblies, staff sessions and group work. We are looking into the possibility of setting up a group specifically aimed at our young carers.

A young carer is someone under the age of 18 who helps look after someone who could not manage without his or her help. This could mean looking after a parent, brother or sister, grandparent or family friend who has a disability, long-term illness, or drug and alcohol related issues.

As many as one in 12 pupils are thought to have caring responsibilities, whilst we already know of some students who are young carers, we believe there may be more across our school who would benefit from the extra support we can provide. Some young carers worry about bullying and may be tired, worried, find it difficult to concentrate and have limited time for friendships and activities after school. If this is the case, we can help; by offering for example extra help with homework, flexibility around calling home, advice about how to get your child into school where transport may be an issue, a teacher to talk to and alternatives to after school activities. We can also provide advice on benefits, local support groups and more.

Do you think you have a Young Carer in your household? Please do let us know, even if you might not need any extra support currently. 

# **7<sup>th</sup> March Parent Workshop - Sexual Harassment** and Language Handout

Sexual harassment is **any unwanted sexual behaviour that makes someone feel upset**, **scared**, **offended or humiliated**, or is meant to make them feel that way.

Sexist language is inherently discriminatory language, either written or spoken, that implies an unjustified sexual bias against a group or an individual, usually women, but sometimes men.

All pupils have seen this:



Misogyny contributes to a wider picture of harmful attitudes which can escalate, as shown in this pyramid.

You may call it a 'joke' or 'banter', but these can soon contribute to extreme behaviours.

What we do as a school to tackle sexual harassment.

- One to one conversations with teacher or HOY
- Restorative meetings with HOY
- Work pack one sexism We have an example for you to see.
- Green button for staff
- Personal Development Sessions and Assemblies
- Any incidents are logged on CPOMs, our safeguarding programme, which alerts LT and necessary staff of the incident so follow up can take place.


