Results cannot be given out over the telephone, either. Please mark any envelopes sent to the office as 'Results Day' so we can easily pick it out from the summer holiday post.

Music Industry Day - 11th July

Some of our students were involved in a **Music Industry Day** on 11th July. The workshop was delivered by IEMusic, specialising in delivering curriculum relevant music workshops in UK schools. Workshop leaders and attending artists offer up to date music industry advice in a fun and engaging way.





Our students worked in small groups and were able to explore their song writing and performance skills over the course of a full day under the supervision of an attending artist Alex Hawkins. Each group then took to the stage to demonstrate their work and received artist and class feedback.



At the end of the day, students became an audience for an inspirational performance by Alex himself as well as careers talk and questions time from the workshop leader.



School Meal Price Increases

There will be an increase to the cost of school meals which will take effect on our return from the summer break.

We have always tried to keep our meal prices affordable to families and our last price increase was pre-covid. As you will be aware, since then, there has been a significant increase in costs associated with meal production - both in relation to food supplies and energy costs. The Wensum Trust has been standing the cost of increases, but is now in a position where it has had to review the situation.

To ensure we can continue to fund a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements, and is served in a safe environment on our school premises, we will be increasing our meal deal price from £2.30 to £2.55 per day from 1st September 2023. This increase will also apply to our other food products on offer. If your child is in Year 7-11 and you are in receipt of any of the following, you may also be eligible for free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, plus, from 19 April 2022, those with no recourse to public funds.
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) at the time of your application.

Next year - new school skirts

Ready for September, we will be introducing a new school skirt to replace the straight skirt that is currently available. We have had a number of issues over the years with the straight skirt including poor fit, seams breaking and many girls choosing to roll the skirt up to unacceptable levels. The new skirt will be a straight fit with two pleats at the front which will allow more movement and flexibility for girls. The pleated full skirt will still be available. Students who already own a straight skirt will not need to purchase a new skirt, we will phase this in gradually, but the straight skirt will no longer be available to purchase from Stevenson's. The new style skirt should be available on the Stevenson's website imminently.

RSC Playmaking Event

On Friday 14th July, Mr Frost and Mrs Barber took 15 students across years 7 - 10 to the Royal Shakespeare Company's playmaking event which took place at the Norwich Theatre Playhouse. We have been lucky enough to become a Lead Associate school with the Royal Shakespeare Company, as part of their outreach programme. In this introductory year, staff have benefited from training with the RSC and this culminated in Friday's event for students. They got to work in a professional space, and experienced workshops on lighting and sound, writing, and acting, which culminated in a sharing at the end of the day to the other schools. We focussed on Romeo and Juliet and students were able to work on interpreting the play and approaching practical work in different ways... a thoroughly enjoyable day had by all! There will be many more student events to follow next academic year, so watch this space!

Strasbourg and Black Forest Trip

On Thursday, we were really excited to set off on our first foreign languages trip since lockdown, taking a group of Year 9 and 10 languages students to Strasbourg in France and the Black Forest in Germany.

It was a late start, travelling through the night and arriving in Strasbourg on Friday evening. On the way, we took the opportunity to see another country, stopping in Luxembourg for lunch!

As it was 14th July, Bastille Day, after a quick but delicious dinner in the hotel we went for a walk into central Strasbourg to see the festivities in the central square and experience the fantastic atmosphere of live music and traditional stalls selling local food.

Early on Saturday, after a wonderful breakfast, we set off for our first activity of the day — a visit to a traditional gingerbread factory. Here we learnt about the history of gingerbread and even had the opportunity to try lots of different varieties. Almost everyone took the opportunity to buy some great souvenirs before we set off on our next adventure to Kehl in Germany. Here we climbed a viewing tower to see the Black Forest and walked across the bridge over the Rhine which is the border between the two countries. It's not often that you get the chance to have one foot in one country and one in another!

Then it was back to Strasbourg for a boat trip through the city and our evening meal in a traditional Tarte Flambée/Flammkuchen restaurant (a type of flatbread pizza, which usually has crème fraiche, onion and bacon on it, although we had the chance to try different flavours such as goat's cheese with honey and spicy Mexican)

Sunday was the eagerly anticipated trip back across the border into Germany to Europa Park theme park, home of the fastest rollercoaster in Europe! The students had a wonderful day exploring the park and experiencing lots of different rides. Everyone had an amazing time! On the way back to the hotel, we stopped off at a Flunch restaurant where the students could choose from a wide selection of traditional French or more familiar dishes for dinner. It was wonderful to see so many students trying things that they had never tasted before.

Bright and early Monday morning we were on our way home, breaking the journey half way for lunch in Belgium.




Please remember to check ClassCharts


