Does our school qualify for funding?



We often approach schools, or are approached by schools, to discuss the qualification for funding. Many schools believe that they are not entitled to any funding as they do not meet the criteria set by the Department for Education.

Since we were initially awarded funding in 2019 we have been awarded 'Accelerator Funding' which is open to state funded schools with primary aged children. This includes, Special Schools, PRU, Junior schools, Ofsted Good/Outstanding.
