#### **SAFEGUARDING AND CHILD PROTECTION**

Because of our day-to day contact with the children, we are particularly well placed to observe outward signs of abuse, changes in behaviour or failure to develop. We have a duty to protect children from abuse; however, our role is in recognition and referral, not investigation or intervention. We are required by law to follow procedures laid down by the Norfolk Safeguarding Children Board if we see signs which suggest that one of our pupils may have been the victim of abuse. Use of the procedures in this way in an obligation placed on the school by legislation and in no way infers that any parent/carer is being accused of wrong-doing.

Lodge Lane is registered with Operation Encompass. This means that Norfolk Police will contact the school concerning any domestic incidents which involve the families of our children the day after the incident occurred.

# Attendance Matters

## **ATTENDANCE**

You have already received a letter about attendance and as you know, this is something we monitor carefully.

You should be aware that we are not allowed to authorise any holidays during term time unless the circumstances are exceptional. All planned absence during term time should be applied for on the school absence request form at least a week before the absence and you will receive an emailed response. You can pick up a form from the office or it is available on our website.

We are constantly trying to keep our school attendance in line with the national average but we need your support to do this. We are aiming for 97% attendance - last year our attendance increased to 94% - a lot of this was due to genuine illness, but a lot was also due to holidays or odd days off here and there, which we are really trying to avoid.





We are very aware that many parents will still choose to book holidays in term time due to the cost. Y2 parents should be aware that their children will be doing assessments straight after May half term for 3 weeks. Y1 parents should be aware that their children will be practising and doing their phonics screening check straight after May half term for 2 weeks.

The Y2 Leaver's show is on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> July - children who are on holiday in the weeks leading up to this will miss all the rehearsals and the singing practice so it will be very difficult for them to fully participate in the show

#### **Sickness reporting**

If your child is too ill to attend school, you must ring the office by 9am to inform us. If they are off because of sickness or diarrhoea, under 5's must stay off for 72 hours and over 5's for 48 hours after the last 'incident'.

#### **DRINK BOTTLES**

All children need a named water bottle every day – please stick to water and not juice.



#### **WELLIES**

All children need to have a pair of named wellies at school which they should leave at school all week.

# **BOOK BAGS**

Children need to bring their book bag and reading book to school every day. A lot of our books were ruined last year because of drink bottles leaking in book bags so please use the book bag just for books and carry drinks separately.

If your child's book is damaged beyond repair at home, we will ask you to pay for a replacement.





#### **READING BOOKS**

Over the next two weeks, your child's class teacher will be reading with your child to assess their current reading level. Most children will then be placed in a Guided Reading group with children of a similar ability, and will bring home their Little Wandle reading book for the week to practise reading at home with you.

In order to place children in the correct group at a level that is right for them, they may bring home a reading book, which they have previously read. If this is the case, please don't worry - it is good for them to revisit previous books to build up their fluency. They will then move on to new books which they have not had before when we feel they are ready.

Please note: children who are fluent readers will continue to choose from the coloured book bands and can change their books whenever they are ready.

#### **READING IN THE HALL**

Don't forget that the hall is open every morning except Wednesday before school for you to go in and listen to your child read. This was popular last year and the feedback we got was that it was one less job to do at home, and that children were more inclined to read at school than at home.
