We would like to remind all parents that children should not be dropped off at school earlier than 8:30am. This is the time when adults are on duty from on the playground. If children are arriving at school (without an adult staying with them) before this time, they should be booked into Breakfast Club.

Over the last few weeks, we have found a number of pupils (particularly Year 6) arriving as early as 8am.

We need to ensure that everyone is kept safe therefore if anyone is arriving as early as this, we will need to start bringing them into Breakfast Club and parents will be charged via Scopay.



## Non-uniform day for FOF Christmas hampers

On Friday 20 October (last day of this half term), we are holding a non-uniform day to collect donations of items for our Friends of Firside Christmas hamper raffle. So that we receive a range of items, we are asking that children bring the following items in return for a non-uniform day:

Year 3 and 4 - smellies, small gift sets or candles

Year 5 and 6 – chocolates, sweets or biscuits.

All children wearing shirts should now be wearing their school ties. **ALL** ties and jumpers must be named as we have over 350 almost identical items in school every day.

Summer dresses can continue to be worn up until October half term.

School jumpers / cardigans should either be the logo version available from Birds or a dark green jumper / cardigan.

A reminder that leggings are <u>not</u> part of our school uniform and should only be worn as part of PE kit.

Please make sure that children have a named coat in school every day for play times and lunchtimes.







We are once again working alongside APFS (Art Projects For Schools) whereby you can order your child's artwork as Christmas cards to send out to family and friends. By ordering your child's designs, you also help school fundraising as we receive a percentage of all the designs ordered.

This year we are offering this as <u>an optional activity</u> for children to do at home. When they have completed their design, they can bring it into school and we will arrange for it to be sent to the company. You will then be able to purchase Christmas cards and other products with your child's design.

If you would like your child to participate and create their own Christmas card design, they need to follow these important guidelines: Artwork should be created on white or coloured paper / card and must be in A4 in size (avoid using black paper or any with a glossy / shiny finish. Thicker paper or card works better as the label that will be stuck on the back when it is sent off to APFS can show through when scanned if the paper is very thin. Designs can be portrait or landscape – fill the whole page for the best effect when printed but keep any writing away from the edges. To ensure the entirety of the artwork is printed, please leave approximately a 2-3mm edge around the paper, that way no masterpiece will be cut off when scanned. Pencil drawings do not reproduce well and are often not visible when printed so please do not create drawings using pencils. Please also avoid using black backgrounds. Bold colours and collage (maximum depth 5mm) work really well. They do not accept artwork that includes glitter as the glitter contaminates other artwork and damages the machinery used in the printing process. Reflective materials do not reproduce well. If you would like to use pastel colours, they will need to be sprayed with a fixative spray (or hairspray) before being sent in.

All artwork must be given in to the office for the attention of Mrs Seagrave by Wednesday 18 October at the very latest. Any artwork handed in after this date will not be able to be included as we have the send them off to be scanned. Please make sure their name is clearly on the back. The designs will then be sent off to the company over half term. Once they have been scanned by APFS, parents will then be given until 9 November to order their designs. We hope that having cards designed by your own child will be lovely for them because they can see their own work in print, it makes a lovely personalised card and it will also provide lasting memories for family and friends in years to come whilst supporting your school.

## Fish and nut free

A reminder to all families that we aim to be a fish and nut free school. This is due to severe allergies in some children in our school. Please help us to keep them safe by refraining from including fish or nut products in your child's lunchbox. Nut products might include: whole nuts, nuts in cereal bars, peanut butter and Nutella. Fish products might include, but is not limited to: tuna, salmon, fish paste, fish sticks and prawns. We do not serve fish as a hot dinner or jacket potato filling option.

We ask that all parents follow this guidance as food allergies can be very serious. Thank you.
