At Hellesdon High School, we believe that homework is an essential tool for reinforcing and consolidating students' learning. Here are the types of homework that your teachers set.

Knowledge Review: Students will work from Knowledge organisers or use online programmes to review and summarise knowledge or reading materials to consolidate their understanding.

Retrieval Practice: Students will be assigned short quizzes, or questions related to the material covered in class. This helps students retrieve and reinforce their learning.

Application Tasks: Homework may also include tasks where students apply the knowledge they've gained in new contexts, reinforcing their understanding.

Homework assignments will be set regularly, but we aim to strike a balance that considers your wellbeing and life outside of school as well as supporting your academic progress.

Key Stage 3

- Up to 40 minutes each week night on different subjects including Bedrock.
- You are also expected to read regularly throughout the week and complete Accelerated Reader tasks.

Key Stage 4

 You will usually receive around one hour of homework per subject per week. Where you are working towards exams or have coursework deadlines this may vary. Complete homework will be rewarded.

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Ecuador Project Highlights (2011 - 2022)

29 Toilets built

12,000 Native plants and trees planted approximately

Octopus houses built as part of restoring the reef structure around El Pelado

Worked with over 12 schools to improve learning environments and facilities

1,200+ Reforestation of 1,200 orchids

1,000kg Environmental clean-ups resulting in the removal of over 1000kg of rubbish

Did you know?

Ecuador is known as the country of orchids – boasting more than $4,\!000$ different species.


In Ecuador, projects are designed to make a significant and lasting impact on the region's most critical issues. Projects typically focus on:

- Community development through activities such as constructing a neighbourhood recreational area, improving infrastructure at a local high school or sanitation facilities.
- Tackle the issue of waste in the natural environment, by participating in beach clean ups and working on rubbish management projects.
 - Amazon rainforest generation assisting with important environmental projects, collecting saplings and replanting trees in the jungle.


