Jamie Singh in Year 7 History has been nominated for his wonderful essay by Mr Sayce on the Battle of Hastings.











Kaitlin Campbell






The Children's Commissioner for England has recently launched 'The Big Ambition' to hear directly from children, young people and parents across the country.




Please remember to check ClassCharts

ClassCharts is our main form communication to keep up to date with daily updates and progress, messages. ClassCharts is used to communicate pride points, behaviour points and interventions.
