Secure Site Update

As mentioned in last week's Bulletin, contractors have been on site installing fencing at the front of the school. I am now pleased to inform you that the works have completed and our school is now a fully secure site.

Due to this change, we have removed some of our "one way" systems around school to help students move around easily and safely.

We understand that with this change, students will need to find new routes to their classrooms, which may to start with cause slight lateness to lessons, which we will take into consideration on an individual basis.

However, we will still be challenging students who are persistently late.

Message from Miss Mason, Assistant Principal

During lessons over the past half term, teachers have been encouraging students to develop their inquisitive habits by asking challenging questions.

Questions are really useful in working out what students know and understand; but challenging and engaging questions can encourage students to explore ideas and concepts too.

Challenging questions can motivate and engage students with their learning. They can help teachers to draw attention to key points and they can encourage discussion and collaboration. When students think and formulate their answers, it promotes creative and critical thinking. Questioning helps students to activate prior knowledge and learning and encourages them to apply their learning to new situations and scenarios.

In lessons, teachers encourage all students to participate and respond to questions. Teachers allow for thinking time so students can form and express their opinions. A range of different questioning techniques are used to suit different learners' needs. During the last term, I have seen excellent examples of questioning and student response in lessons across the different subjects. I have also seen students asking important and relevant questions themselves, further developing their own skills of inquiry.
