Open Heart Week- 12th - 16th February

February is the British Heart Foundation's Heart month and in light of this we will be raising awareness of congenital heart disease with a week-long theme of activities and events.

Mrs McNulty will be leading assemblies on heart disease looking at the causes and prevention. In Science lessons, students across all Year groups will learn about the functions of the heart. In form time, students will get the opportunity to learn CPR. In PE lessons, students will take part in a healthy heart relay competition. Selected students will be invited to take part in a STEM focused activity involving a dissection of a heart.

In addition, students will be able to take part in a number of creative opportunities themed around hearts including Art activities and Valentine's poetry in English. We are incredibly fortunate to be able to host the RSC who will be performing 'Romeo and Juliet' and students in Year 11 will have the opportunity to watch the performance which will aid their GCSE preparation.

We will be holding a number of charity events including a bake sale, a doughnut sale and a non-uniform day. All money raised will go towards Great Ormond Street Hospital which specialises in children's care. Students and staff alike are encouraged to give £1 to support this fundraising event. 

Norwich Theatre has been working in partnership with the RSC for a number of years as part of the RSC's Associate Schools Programme. Acle Academy is one of two secondary schools that leads a cluster of Associate Schools in Norfolk.

Acle Academy joined the programme in 2022 and has been working with Norwich Theatre and the RSC to use Shakespeare's work and arts-based learning in the curriculum.

The RSC's series of *First Encounters* with Shakespeare productions, 'Romeo and Juliet', will be performed at Acle Academy, as part of a 12-week national tour of schools and regional theatres. Aimed at new and younger audiences, *First Encounters: Romeo and Juliet* is an adrenaline-charged 90-minute take on Shakespeare's classic tale of love and loss. The show is directed by Trybe House Theatre Artistic Director, Philip J Morris and in a reworking of the Prince of Verona's role, ten of our students will also perform as members of a Prince's counsel alongside the professional RSC actors.

This is an incredible opportunity for our students who will take part in the play that will be shown in the afternoon to all of Year 11 students and then an additional performance in the evening for our community. Additionally, our students will have the opportunity to perform in a performance at the Playhouse theatre on Saturday 17th February. Theatre Performance- Outskirts

On Wednesday the 31st January we were very excited and lucky to welcome local Actor Ashton Owen to Acle Academy. Year 7 and 8 had the opportunity to take part in his performance of 'Outskirts'.

Ashton, from North Walsham, knows exactly how it feels to be one of only a tiny handful of mixed race or black pupils at a rural school: and he's written about it. Outskirts is a semi-autobiographical coming-of-age story set in North Norfolk about a fictional character called Aiden and the people he comes into contact with.

The piece was originally part of a Rewriting Rural Racism project being led by young performers from Sheringham Little Theatre. Mr Owen said: "I hope the play gets people to think about what they say and do, and how it impacts on people of colour. "We are trying to make people more aware of issues faced by people living in rural areas, by highlighting real experiences, so they realise it happens here as well as the United States."

The students were a real credit to the school, welcoming Ashton, saying after that they really enjoyed it, they asked some very thoughtful questions and were very mature about a very difficult topic. Special mention to students Alfie C, Harry B, Arthur H, Maisy L and Mr Frost who supported Ashton with lights and sounds for both performances. Thank you! -Mrs Skarin

WWI Battlefields Trip

From Wednesday 17th to Friday 19th January, students from Year 9 and Year 10 took part in the WWI Battlefields Trip to Belgium and France. Students arrived at school bright and early on Wednesday morning to begin the journey down to Dover, where they caught the ferry over to Calais and got started straight away. Our first visit was to a very snowy, Lijssenthoek British Cemetery and Visitors Centre, where students were introduced to some key aspects of treatment of injuries and the processes surrounding this on the British sector of the Western Front, during World War One. Later that afternoon, students visited one of the famous Belgian chocolate shops and then took part in the Last Post ceremony at the Menin Gate. Three of our students laid a wreath as part of the ceremony and took an active role in this incredibly important act of remembrance.







Day two began with a trip to Vimy Ridge, a significant Canadian Memorial Park, where students got to explore some reconstructed trenches and visit the impressive statue that marks the important contributions of Canadian troops to the Allied war effort. From here, we made our way to the Somme. Students explored the Thiepval Memorial and read some WWI poetry beneath the cross of sacrifice. We also explored Mill Road Cemetery, Newfoundland Park and the Hawthorn Crater before returning to Ypres.

On our final day, students made an early morning visit to Essex Farm Cemetery and Dressing Station where they explored underground bunkers that were used to treat casualties during World War One. Students learned about the work of Canadian Lieutenant-Colonel, John McCrae, author of the famous memorial poem, 'In Flanders Fields' We also visited the grave of the 15 year old soldier and had an opportunity to reflect on those under-age soldiers who tragically sacrificed their lives in this conflict. From there, students visit Bayernwald (Croonaert Wood), the site of reconstructed German trenches and then Langemark, a Germany Cemetery where more than 44,000 German soldiers were laid to rest. Our tour ended at Tyne Cot British Cemetery where students had a final opportunity to explore and where some students were able to locate the names/headstones of ancestors.







We hope students enjoyed the trip and learned a lot from it!

The Woman in Black Theatre Trip

On Wednesday 17th January the English Department took 95 year eight students to Norwich Theatre Royal to watch the matinee performance of The Woman in Black. Cleverly crafted, with just two actors on stage, they were treated to a brilliant performance which added an extra plot line to the original novel where the main character is planning a performance himself to tell his ghostly tale. One of our students commented that "it was like a play within a play".

From studying the novel, the students expected the play to be a bit scary in places and it didn't disappoint. The arrival of The Woman in Black herself was surprising as she crept along an aisle brushing past audience members almost unseen. Students said "it was scary!"

As the story unfolded, it became more jumpy with one year eight saying "I screamed so many times". The atmosphere of the story was created with eerie sound effects and special effect smoke which "really added to the surroundings" said one of our students.

It was a brilliant afternoon and the whole group thoroughly enjoyed it.

Thank you to all the parents for completing the parental consent so promptly. We are now in the process of starting to collect the Employer Placement form, which informs us about the placement that your child will attend and enables us to carry out risk assessments and safeguarding checks. The deadline for the placement form, which students need to share with the employers to complete and then return to Acle Academy is coming up rapidly. We will need placement forms to be returned to Acle Academy by 21st March 2024, in order for us to process the placements with the county council before students are able to attend their work experience.

We feel that work experience is a really important and valuable experience for students to take part in and we aim for all students to find a placement. Please can we urge parents/carers to support the students in finding placements, and to stick to the deadline. As stated before placements are to be student/ parent generated, but if your child is really struggling please do contact Mrs Skarin or Ms Denny and we might be able to support with suggested placements.


Please remember to check ClassCharts
