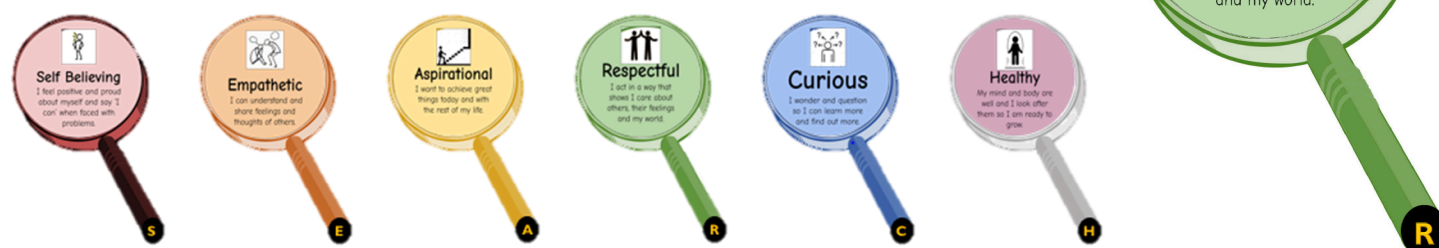




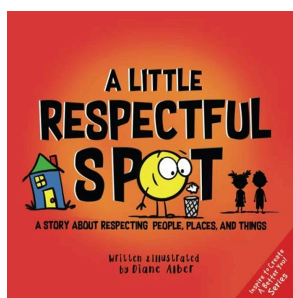
This half term we will be focusing on our school value of **Respectful**.

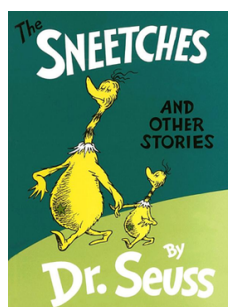
Being respectful is important because it helps you feel good about yourself and your place in the world and helps you get along with others.



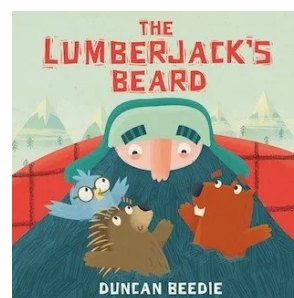

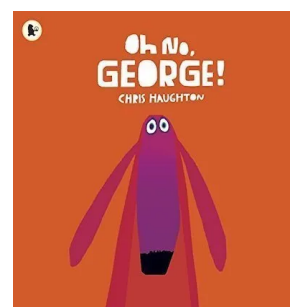

Summary of our Safeguarding Procedures for anyone in Arden Grove Infant and Nursery School

Arden Grove Infant and Nursery School is committed to the highest standards in protecting and safeguarding the children entrusted to our care.

Our school will support all children by:


- Promoting a caring, safe and positive environment
- Encouraging self-esteem and self-assertiveness
- Teaching the children to respect the feelings of others and play safely and appropriately with their friends.


We recognise that some children may be the victims of neglect, physical, sexual or emotional abuse. Staff working with children are well placed and trained to identify such abuse.


At our school in order to protect our children, we aim to:

- Create an atmosphere where all our children feel secure, valued and listened to
- Recognise signs and symptoms of abuse
- Respond quickly, appropriately and effectively to cases of suspected abuse
- Continually monitor and review our practice.

If you have a concern that a child is being harmed, is at risk of harm, or you receive a disclosure (intentionally or unintentionally) you must contact the following staff members as quickly as possible.

If anything worries you or concerns you, please report it straight away

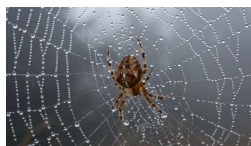
Online Safety: Online safety is an important topic for us as teachers and are sure it is on your mind as parents. Our Learning this half term: Hellesdon in our hearts.

Most of our curriculum is inspired by our local area and local people. We use these as a starting point before exploring beyond these and finding out about the wider world. This half term lots of learning, especially in Key Stage One is inspired by Norwich Airport, encouraging the children to think about travelling, flying and transport.



Nursery- Little Swallowtails



This half term in Little Swallowtails Nursery will focus on settling the children into Nursery life, building relationships with their adults and their peers. Nursery will continue to 'learn through the seasons' with the weeks learning focusing on the joys of Autumn including leaves and spiders.

We have renamed the nursery Little Swallowtails after the yellow and black butterfly only found on the Norfolk Broads. This is to link with our other classes named after Broads names.

Reception



In Salhouse and Filby class they will be focusing on helping the children settle into the routines and life of Reception. They will be starting phonics and maths when the children are ready. They will be thinking about the question: **Where are those planes going?** Reception will go plane spotting, make predictions about where the planes are going, look at world maps to find out more and make models of the aircraft they spot.

Year 1: Where have you been on your holidays?



In Wroxham and Ranworth the children will be talking about their exciting summer holidays. They will be learning about the 7 continents of the world and the four countries of the United Kingdom and finding these on a map. They will be creating artwork inspired by their different holidays and journeys as well as exploring with colour mixing and paintings.

Year 2: Help from the Air



This half term we will be learning more about the East Anglian Air Ambulance. We will find out what the big yellow helicopter we often see over our school does and where it might be going and why. Our 'geographer' part will help us find out more about good and bad landing sites, look at maps and photographs to help the air ambulance on its missions. We will meet volunteers from the charity who will talk to us about their work and the helicopter. In DT, we will be designing new emergency rescue vehicles to help the East Anglian Air Ambulance save lives.

If you think you or a member of your family or a friend could offer any exciting experiences or information that link to any of our classes themes we would love to hear from you. Please contact the school office as we are always keen to make, maintain and strengthen links with our families and community. With all children, getting interested in their learning at home always help them connect their learning. You could talk to them about what they have been learning about, go on days out that may link or visit our local library at Hellesdon for books to share about their topic or anything!
