## **Staffing for the Summer Term**

Following a strong field of candidates, we are delighted to announce that we have appointed Miss Jenny Beard to the position of Year 4 teacher for the Summer Term. Miss Beard is an ex-member of KS2 staff, who taught here a few years ago before relocating to Wales. We are so pleased she will be rejoining the strong teaching team here again. We are still recruiting for the Year R teaching position and will update parents and the community, as soon as we have an appointment.

Mrs Beck and I will be a clear presence in school throughout the school week during the Summer Term. I will be working at Wells a minimum of 3 days a week (Monday to Wednesday, and more if needed) and Mrs Beck will be here Tuesday-Friday. Discussions are still taking place at a Central Team level regarding the structure of the leadership of the school from September and as soon as we have a confirmed plan, we will be recruiting to this as directed. This will be detailed on the school newsletter for all parents to see and I will keep you updated. Mrs Kerkham will be trained as a third Designated Safeguarding Lead, so we will always have coverage regarding this essential issue too.

As a school, being part of The Wensum Trust, we have a zero tolerance policy towards parents demonstrating verbally aggressive behaviour towards our staff. - 1. In the first instance, the school will verbally inform the complainant that their behaviour is considered to becoming unreasonable/unacceptable and if not modified, action may be taken.
- 2. If the behaviour is not modified the school may take further action as necessary such as; sending a letter, banning the complainant from the school site or taking legal action.

We do hope that you will continue to work with us in a supportive manner so that together, we can continue to provide the best we can for our children and families. Thank you for your ongoing support with this matter.

# Children's safety on the playground morning/afternoon

Please can we remind parents to keep a close eye on their children both at the beginning of the school day and at the end. Children are not to be running around the canteen building as this is unsafe. Mr Dorman is making a new gate for this area, even though it is not on the school site. Children do not access any of this area within school time, so please can parents watch over children when entering and leaving the school from that gate - we want to make sure that all children are safe. Also, if you are concerned about any children on the playground before school, please do speak directly to the members of school staff that are outside on duty each morning, rather than approaching other children yourselves.
