We have noticed an increased number of children are turning up to school later in the morning. We would like to remind everyone that the school day starts at 8:45am. This means that pupils need to be on the school site **before** 8:45am ready to come into school for their registers. Registers are started from 8:45am.

Punctuality is important to ensure that children are registered as present but also provides the children with a settled start to the morning and means that they are not missing important learning at the start of lessons. Lots of children also find it difficult to come into class when they know the rest of their class are settled and working. Children are learning in class from 8:45am- make sure your child is not missing out.

Firside Junior School Christmas Postal Service
