Support and Funding Online Briefing

We are so glad that schools have been finding our 'Support and Funding' briefings useful in helping them access funding this year. We are happy to share that we have been allocated additional funding for Primary, Junior, Special and Alternative Provision schools to access before the end of the school year. Any State-Funded school, with primary aged children, may be entitled to up to £9,000 in free funding towards phonics and reading. We have also been allocated funding to offer a number of Literacy Specialist consultancy support days.


Waterstones Children's Laureate

Engaging Children with Vision Impairment in Stories

BookTrust talked to RNIB about how teachers can engage children with a visual impairment in reading. Services like RNIB and Guide Dogs can provide audio materials and reading materials in Braille to facilitate accessibility. RNIB recommends teachers and parents to adopt a multi-sensory approach to storytelling, which will engage the child further and allow them to have a positive experience when it comes to reading.
