I will be handing out attendance certificates for students with 100% attendance this term and bronze, silver and gold badges depending on how many terms this year they have had 100% attendance.

I do appreciate that there are a number of students whose attendance can never be 100% due to underlying medical issues and/or the need for regular appointments during the school day. Unfortunately, it is impossible to pick those students out in order to award them individually but I do acknowledge they deserve recognition if their attendance would otherwise be excellent.

Next year I will continue to work closely with the Heads of Year and intend to have more contact with parents/carers in order to support students that are struggling to attend. We all want to work with parents/carers to give students the best possible experience in school so they can achieve their full potential when they leave us.

This year there has, in my professional opinion, been a lot of avoidable absences for minor illness that would not really affect a student's ability to learn, or students avoiding school following an incident instead of coming to school and reporting it/seeking support from their Head of Year etc. From September we will be making daily calls to parents to encourage students to come to school later in the day, or return the following day to prevent prolonged absences.

As always, I ask for your support with this as it is vital that we all work together to encourage and advocate regular school attendance.

Land and Sea

It was a busy few days for the students on this pathway who experienced all the local area has to offer in terms of nature.

On Monday we took the train to Great Yarmouth where we firstly walked to the Waterways for some creative writing/art inspiration. Students took time to admire the Venetian bridges, boats and a lovely pond complete with Monet style lilies and fish and made sketches/notes to take back to school.

We then walked along the beach, stopping at the pier for photos and ice creams/doughnuts in the sunshine before continuing. Lunch was eaten on the beach where we were ambushed by the local seagulls after some food! Coupled with this we found ourselves covered in ladybirds which were in abundance on the seafront. The students loved their impromptu game of football and engaged in some traditional seaside activities which included digging and making sandcastles!

After taking the train back to school, the students made sketches of their favourite scenes ready for use on Wednesday.

On day two we explored the woodland areas of Acle, starting with a walk through the fields to Upton where we found a secret forest and collected leaves/rubbings for our art work in school. We all enjoyed spotting and trying to identify the different crops in the fields - barley, wheat, potatoes, sugar beet to name but a few.

After break we walked around the back of the school through the forest area to stop at the sundial where a beautiful back view of the school can be seen. Students made sketches here and took some wonderful photos before heading back for lunch.

In the afternoon we walked to the river at Acle Bridge where we stopped for a well-deserved drink/snack at a delightful converted horsebox café and enjoyed feeding the ducks which had come to see us.

On day three we started with a nature-themed team quiz, then students were given the choice to either create some Aboriginal-style art, or do some creative writing. Students were really engaged with exploring different symbols and layering of colour to create pictures of landscapes, creatures or objects that they had encountered around Great Yarmouth and Acle. Using their photographs to inspire them, they created some amazing artwork!

Other students spent time doing “frenzied writing” about a prompt randomly selected from a spinning wheel of options. We then looked at creating Kennings (two-word phrases used to replace a noun, such as “sky-reflector” instead of “sea”) then created a story that included a range of these. Afterwards, we listened to some rainforest sounds and created a short description inspired by what it made us imagine. Finally, we had some time to create a short story based on photographs taken from the first two days. The ideas and writing created during this time was so impressive!

Later in the day, students had the choice of creating a newspaper article or a travel brochure page based on their travels earlier in the week. We also ran a scavenger hunt after lunch, with students split into teams to see which side could find all of the objects from their cards first. Finally, we rounded the day off by creating some nature-themed board games and then had a game of football on the field to enjoy the sunshine. It was a busy day, but one filled with creativity and enjoyment of the great outdoors.

Royal Shakespeare Company's Playmaking Festival

During Curriculum Enhancement Week, selected students took part in this year's 2025 Royal Shakespeare Company Playmaking Festival, as part of our role as an associate school with them.

Students worked alongside a visiting director from the RSC, as well as staff from Norwich Theatre to put on designated scenes from Shakespeare's famous comedy *Midsummer Night's Dream*.

Other associate schools from the cluster were assigned different scenes and we came together across Monday and Tuesday to put it all together on the Norwich Playhouse stage. Acle's students were tasked with putting on the mechanicals scene and rose to the task of staging this brilliantly!

The performance was on the Tuesday evening and there was a sell-out crowd! Parents and family members were given free tickets to see the show, and they all left extremely proud of their children, as were we as staff!

It was a genuine joy to see our talented young actors perform their scenes that they have been working on for weeks and I know they felt extremely proud of themselves too!

All The World's A Stage:

For those of us on the 'All the World's a Stage' pathway, what a treat it was to spend Monday with the wonderful playwright James Fritz. We spent the day learning tips and tricks for writing excellent stories and scripts. The pupils experimented with weird and wonderful storylines and read each other's scripts in a whole manner of different ways. James has had his plays performed on stages in London, New York and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, and his passion for this profession is palpable. His positivity is infectious! The students brought bucket loads of talent and enthusiasm and a fabulous day was enjoyed by all!



As part of the History department's curriculum enhancement pathway, students took part in *Shadows of Justice*, an immersive exploration of crime and punishment through time. The experience began with a visit to Norwich Castle, where students investigated the changing nature of justice and punishment, using the historic site to trace how these ideas evolved over centuries. They explored the grounds, stood on the site of executions, handled and examined tools of punishment from centuries gone by and took part in the re-enactment of the famous trial of James Blomfield Rush in the courtroom. They then travelled to the Tower of London, viewing the Crown Jewels and delving into the complex and varied roles the Norman fortress has played throughout history. Students embarked on three different trails around this historic landmark and learned all about its use as a royal palace, a prison and even a zoo! On the final day, students brought their learning together in a focused project on the infamous Jack the Ripper case, using historical inquiry to examine crime in Victorian London. The pathway deepened students' understanding of justice across time and encouraged them to think critically about the historical context of law and order. We hope all of the students enjoyed their time with us and hope they will continue to explore this fascinating aspect of our country's history.

Creative Cushions in Year 9 Textiles

Our Year 9 Textiles students at Acle Academy have been showcasing their creativity and developing practical skills through an exciting cushion-making project. Over the past few weeks, pupils have been designing and producing their own square cushions, incorporating stencil printing techniques to create bold, eye-catching patterns.

Students began by experimenting with stencil designs, carefully planning their motifs before printing them onto fabric panels. This hands-on process allowed them to explore colour, shape, and repetition, building confidence in their artistic abilities. Once their prints were complete, students moved on to constructing the cushions, using sewing machines to piece together their patchwork designs.

The use of sewing machines has helped students improve their technical skills and understand the importance of precision and attention to detail in textile work. After assembling the fabric panels, they added stuffing to bring their cushions to life, resulting in vibrant, personalised creations that reflect each student's unique style.

This project not only strengthened their practical abilities but also encouraged independent thinking and problem-solving—essential skills for future learning. We are incredibly proud of their progress and look forward to seeing more exciting work from our talented young designers in the months ahead.

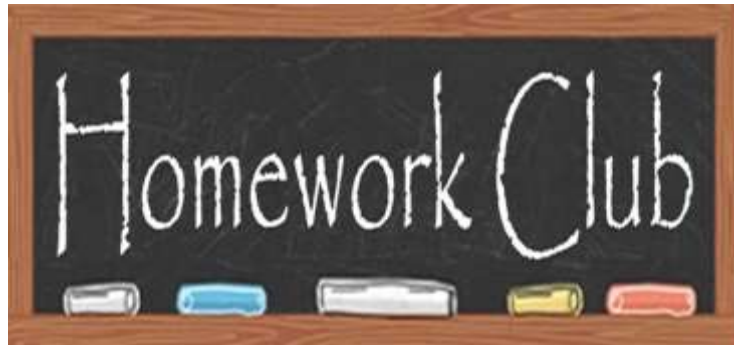
The Big Norfolk Holiday Fun (BNHF) activity programme provides holiday activities for children and young people aged 5-16 (or 4 if your child is in reception) in Norfolk.

The Department for Education's funding for the programme has been extended for a further year, after 4 initial years of their support.

Children who receive benefits-related free school meals can claim free spaces on the activities, whilst paid spots are available on many activities for those who don't.
