



Sports Premium 2024-2025

Since the government allocation, from September 2013, of funding to schools in order to support the provision and quality of P.E. and sport we endeavour to utilise this to get the best value for money and maximise its impact across the school. This year we will approximately receive £17,100.

Evaluation of each aim

As a result of the additional funding we aim to:

- * Subscribe to the WNDSSP membership and Jasmine to provide subject leads with ongoing curriculum support. Membership provided guidance and support. Mentoring sessions were provided. This enabled subject leads to carry out staff evaluations and book in CPD as an outcome of this. Regular competitions for different year groups within the sports partnership for various sports.
- * Provide time for subjects leads to meet through supply costs to enable discussions around PE assessment and curriculum development. P.E leads were able to discuss the school's needs, vision and curriculum. Time given to plan for upcoming sports events and to book any required CPD for staff.
- * Provide a variety of activities to promote 'Health Week' to support children's mental and physical wellbeing. A successful health week took place. Children were given the opportunity to take part in different sports and workshops including a visit from dental nurses and taking part in a 'Healthy, Happy, Active' workshop.
- * Take part in workshops and festivals run by 'North Walsham Rugby Club' All year groups took part in a rugby workshop at school followed by a rugby festival at North Walsham Rugby Club.
- * Provide CPD to teachers to continually improve teaching and learning. Twilight sessions provided to upskill teachers in teaching fundamental pe, with a focus on core strength and pre-writing skills.
- * Provide lunchtime provision through CSF to keep children active at lunchtimes Regular lunchtime provision on a Friday to promote activity and enjoyment of sports at lunchtime.
- * Provide music and movement sessions for Nursery aged children to support children's gross-motor skills Weekly sessions provided to support children's early communication skills alongside developing their physical skills.
- * Provide Mini Monkey gym sessions for Early Years across Nursery and Reception to promote the development of gross-motor skills 10 week course provided for children in Early Years. These sessions developed the children's gross-motor skills to support early writing skills.
- * Run 'Learn to ride' sessions for Year 2 children who are less confident riding at bike to develop confidence and biking skills Course provided for children who were less confident to ride a bike to develop their confidence and enjoyment of riding a bike.
