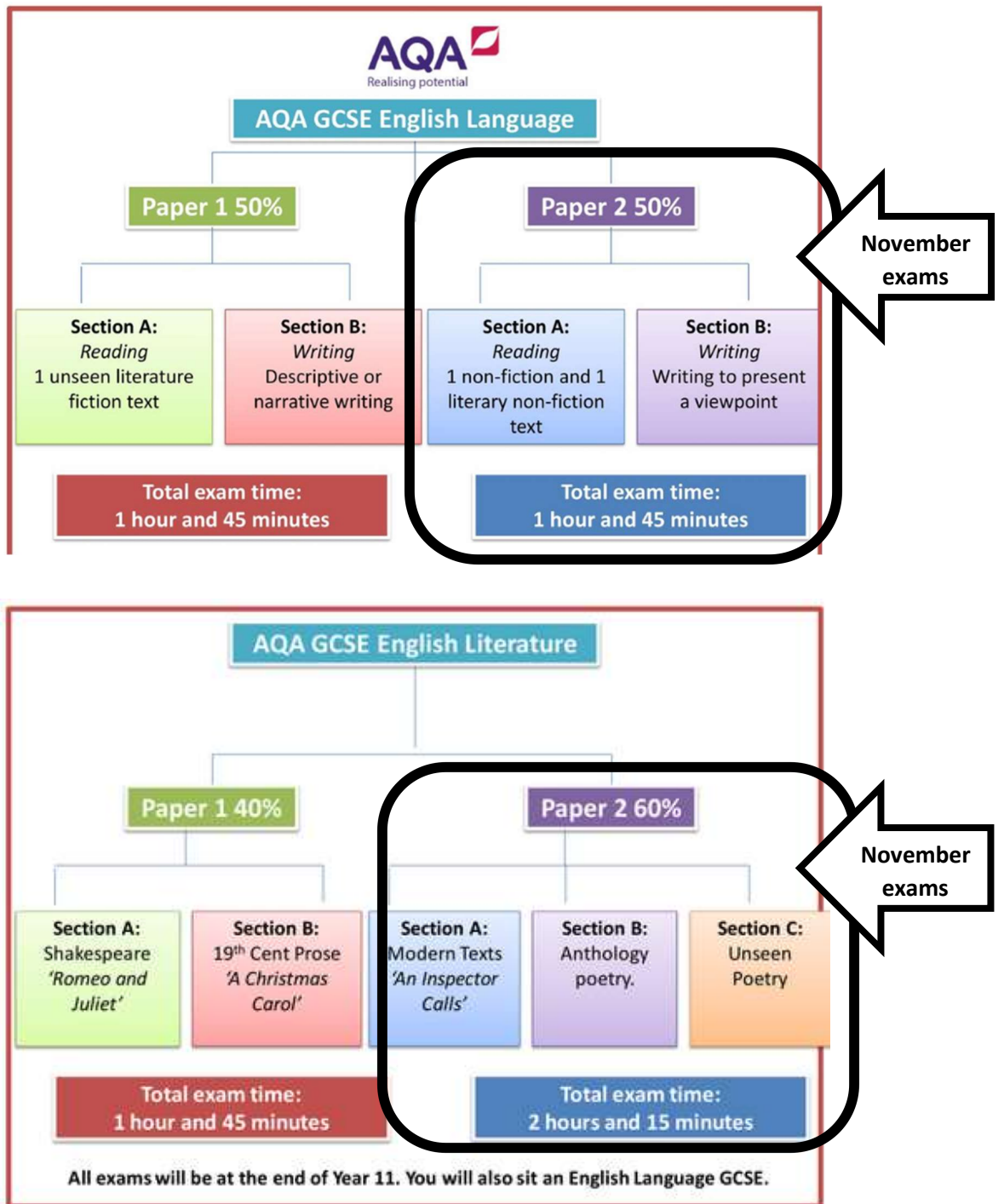
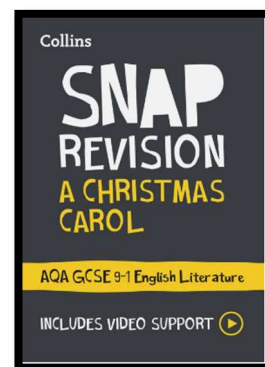
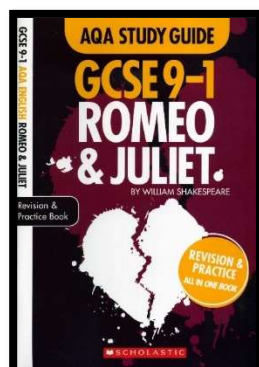
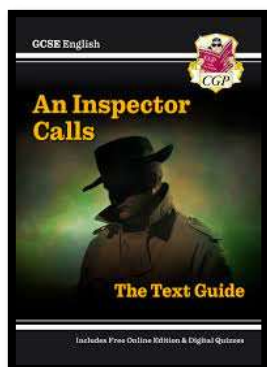


Y11 25-26 GCSE ENGLISH COURSE OVERVIEW
