

This week we have:

- In Maths, Year 1 have been practicing place value within 20 looking at tens and ones and making them on a tens frame. Year 2 have begun learning about height and length. We have looked at what units we measure in and if something is too long or tall for a 30cm ruler then we have discussed and used a meter ruler.
- English— The children have continued thinking about items from the past, linked to our History unit of work this term. We have looked at the different between facts and opinions and even had a go at writing our own ones about artefacts.
- In History, we have been investigating our enquiry question “have men and women always been treated the same?” This hook has really created curious learners throughout KS1 who are left wanting to know more.

Things to do at home:

Year 1— Practise quick recall of number bonds to 10 and ensure your child has retained the phonics sounds taught before Christmas by looking back through their phonics folder. Don't forget to also practise reading and writing the harder to read and spell words!

Year 2— Can your child identify 2D and 3D shapes in the world around them? Keep reading, practicing any sounds unsure of or spellings!
