Attendance

Good school attendance and punctuality is crucial and impacts hugely on learning and progress.

An unauthorised absence of 10 consecutive sessions (5 days) or more will result in a penalty fine being issued.

Please ensure children arrive at school between 8.40am to 8.50am and collected at the end of the day between 3.00pm-3.10pm. Medical and dental appointments should be made out of school hours or in the holidays please where possible. Our school bell rings promptly at 8.40am when the classroom doors open, and it will sound again at 8.50am as the doors are locked.

Please ensure you inform us if your child is unwell. The office opens at 8.15am each morning. If your child has a minor cough or cold and you are in two minds whether to send them to school, please send them in and we will ring you if they feel unwell during the school day. Children should not be absent from school if they have head lice. This needs to be treated appropriately and then they may attend school normally.

We thank you for your support in ensuring that our school attendance improves.
